The September equinox arrives on Sept. 23, 2015 at 8:21 UTC. Although the equinox happens at the same moment worldwide, your clock time will depend on your time zone. For our U.S. time zone, this equinox comes at 3:21 CDT. In the Northern Hemisphere, the sun is rising later now, and nightfall comes sooner. This is our autumn equinox, when the days are getting shorter with day and night approximately equal in length. We are enjoying the cooler days while preparing for winter. South of the equator, spring begins. Now, for those of you who don't get what I mean...WE ARE RUNNING OUT OF DAYLIGHT! This is the best it gets for ultralight flying. The crops are leaving the fields, leaving more room for landings. The days are cooler with less thermals. The landscape is beautiful and gives you lots of things to look at as you fly around at 500 feet AGL.

We will be looking forward to Saturday, Sept. 26 for lunch at the "Field of Dreams". 

An Aviation Learning Opportunity

Kyle passed on some information that might be of interest to anyone who owns an ELSA registered, fixed-wing aircraft:

"Rainbow Aviation is holding a two-day, 16 hour Repairman Inspection-Airplane course October 17-18, in Kenesaw, NE. This course allows the owner of a registered ELSA to complete and sign off his/her own annual condition inspections on any ELSA they own now and in the future. Usually this course is taught at locations which require significant travel expenses. Class registration is limited to 16 due to FAA oversight. It was at least at 9 when I signed up. Cost is \$375 until Oct 6, then goes to \$425. Paperwork (after course completion) must be taken to local your FSDO to get your certificate. Details can be seen at www.rainbowaviation.com."


