Lincoln Area Soaring Society Flight Regulations and Field Rules for the Lancaster Event Center

- 1. The primary purpose of the Lincoln Area Soaring Society (the club) is to practice and promote thermal soaring by model aircraft. Any other flying activities by club members, conducted at the Lancaster Event Center (the field), will be considered secondary to that purpose and will be managed accordingly. All club activities conducted at the field will honor the provisions of any agreement in place between the club and the Lancaster Event Center.
- 2. Electric-powered aircraft flown by club members, not intended for thermal soaring, are welcome to use the field, provided they do not detract from the primary purpose of the club or operate contrary to the provisions of this document.

- 3. The "rise-off-ground" take-off or landing of model aircraft from any paved or unpaved roadway, street, access road, parking lot, camping or exhibition area of the Lancaster Event Center, or any adjacent property, is expressly prohibited.
- 4. The launch, flight and landing of non-powered aircraft will have the right-of-way at all times, and the pilot of any electric-powered aircraft will respect that right-of-way.
- 5. Flying directly above any Lancaster Event Center building, in-progress event or occupied camping area is prohibited.
- 6. Flying in a manner that may disturb any people or animals that are part of a Lancaster Event Center event, or the general public, is prohibited.
- 7. All vehicular traffic by members on or around the field will discern and respect the presence of any winch or hi-start launch equipment on the field.
- 8. All vehicular traffic on or around the field will be conducted in a manner that does not damage the turf or grass.
- 9. The use of the entire field during any scheduled club event will be limited to the purpose and participants in that event.
- 10. Any observed violations of these rules by a club member will subject that member to expulsion from the club, in accordance with provisions in the club constitution.
