Sometimes Beta Means Beta

A recent experience with upgrading the firmware of an electronic speed controller, ESC, taught me to be cautious in using beta grade software. Just prior to taking making a maiden flight with my new electric glider, I upgraded the ESC software for no good reason from a version that was working to a later beta version. When I tried it at the field, the motor didn't spin up. Foolishly being anxious to maiden flight the plane, I launched the plane. It got about fifteen feet before hitting the ground and breaking a blade. At home I found the ESC would cutout at less than half its rated current.

Checking the firmware history on the web, it was noted that the new version I had installed would inappropriately cutout at 90% throttle. The moral of the story is two. Don't believe a beta version will work without testing it first and don't be overly eager to maiden flight a plane. - A.W.
