OLD BUSINESS:

A Boy Scout flying demo was mentioned and that Jim Baker was the "go to" for information on this demo. Also the possibility of a club fun fly was brought up but no dates (or locations) were discussed.

NEW BUSINESS:

Many of us received an email from Jim Baker that the Lancaster Event Center field lease would not be renewed for 2016. Their dirt mining could be considered a safety issue and possibly the reason we are being denied the field use.

Darin Kelstrom had sent an email to Jim about the possibility of using the open field on the west side of Pioneer Park. Jim had contacted Andrea at the Pioneer Park Nature Center who said this area is a nature preserve, and they have already had issues with drones.

Wilson used to fly at Wagon Trail Lake off the spillway on the east side of the dam without any conflict. He will contact Game and Parks to see if that is OK and if they know of any other area we could use. Bruce Jones asked how large of area is ideal for thermal flying and Allan Worrest stated a 1000' circle is idea for an AMA contest.

Jim stated there is a large grass area between the Firth NE retirement home and a lake (Big Nemaha Reservoir) that might belong to the retirement home and Bruce Jones said he would try to find out who owned this land.

Loren Blinde was unable to attend but sent the following email, "Not sure if we still need or want membership cards, given that we've only had them because of the Event center. If the club still wants them, I'd be glad to print a new set without reference to the Event center and mail them if needed.

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
AVIA

Topmodel CZ manufactures numerous conventional and electric model sailplanes and the Avia is one of them. While online companies like SoaringUSA, Icare-Ikarus and Aloft Hobbies sell some of their line, Esprit Tech/ Models may have the largest selection. I purchased my Avia from Esprit as they seem to be the only place that sold one not already covered. With age, I'm beginning to find transparent colors are more difficult to see at a distance than the opaque.

The Avia sports a V-tail. For those who don't like V-tails, Topmodel CZ makes the Prelude which is identical to the Avia but has a mid-located conventional stabilizer. There is an extensive Prelude thread on RCGroups. A less extensive one exists for the Avia.

I brought the Avia to the April meeting was to show the wings before they were covered with opaque film. The wing is a built-up construction with balsa ribs attached to a carbon fiber tube acting as a main spar. If the ribs are spaced too far apart and not glued well to the spar, as was the case with one of my previous sailplanes, the wings will flutter and burst. The Avia rib spacing is closer and in addition there are half ribs in between the full ribs. I expect the Avia wing will be stronger than that other model.
