The Twister is Thane Kirchhoff's own design slope glider. He has been working and improving it over the last several years. He added flaps to the original design.

The plane's pitch and roll are controlled by pivoting the wing panels on the wing rod. The panels are held on magnetically by magnets in the panels and the wing rod. An inexpensive bearing is located between the panels and rod ends to reduce friction.
