The roller is entirely plastic. There is no metal component. The thin shaft on its bottom turns a potentiometer that brings up available selections. The short, thick shaft on top rests on a tactile switch. The switch makes the selection. Pushing the roller on the top is the most effective means of

actuating the switch. But if the roller is pushed on the bottom, the switch is not easily activated and excess pressure can break the bottom shaft.
