

## **FOUR SWEET OLD TIMERS**

Dick Behrens shares these classic old timers with us and provided a little information for those whoa are interested in this type of flying.

#### Top to bottom - span/area - engine class size

 Dallaire
 48 in/285
 Cox 049, class 1/2A

SAM's competition rule for determining the maximum engine size is to take the wing area in sq inches and divide that by 225 to obtain the max two cycle engine and to get the max four cycle engine divide the max two cycle by 80%....This is also a good guide to use for non competition flying.

Old Timer short kits in various sizes can be obtained from Klarich Custom Kits( Klarichkits.com) or Bob Holman (bhplans.com). Both of these are long time vendors.

The Bomber, Playboy and RC-1 were designed with a lifting stab(round on top and flat on bottom). A general rule then for RC thermaling, with the lifting stab, is to have the CG point 45-55% back from the leading edge...... Also since most old timers were designed for free flight, with built in controls to fly themselves, they had 4 to 8 degrees of incidence. Another general rule for RC thermaling is to remove most of this incidence.

more experienced fliers the delicate art of building what you fly.

Everyone is encourage to participate, from novices to expert builders. It is an excellent opportunity to get to know your fellow Omahawks at the same time as you develop your skills as a builder.

I have chosen to participate and am currently building a Great Planes PT-60. It has turned out to be a pretty easy build except for one problem. I bought the kit at an auction several years ago and when I started building it, I found out that there was a sheet of parts missing. So, I had to make up those missing parts by myself. Luckily I have plenty of experience with fabricating replacement parts for my old Avistar, so it wasn't too great of a challenge.

All in all it's working out well for me. I can't wait till the next workshop to see how everybody else is doing.

The second half of the wing is ready to glue. The first half wing waits in the\_ corner The fuselage is done and ready for the final alignment and assembly
