Benson Competition Day



EJ'S LATEST OBSESSION

As some of you know, I participated in my first R/C competition, last year. The 2008 Omaha Pattern Championships was loads of fun, and very informative. I made some new friends, and between them and my fellow Omahawks I got a lot of help and encouragement. Thanks go to Nathan King, Claude Weimer, and Rusty Dose for all their help. I've been bitten by the Pattern bug so bad that I've decided to move up to a pattern specific plane. I found a model I liked from China Model Productions, (CMPro) the Swallow EX90.




It's a 90 size ARF, with a 66" wingspan. I'll be using a Saito FA-91fs engine, with my Spektrum radio. After extensive research, I found a lot of info on improvements and corrections for its short-comings, especially on RCUniverse. The assembly of this ARF may not be as interesting as a large scale warbird, but I thought it might help give others some ideas.



The two main areas that were suggested to beef-up are the fuse-lage side above the wing saddle, and the mounting area for the landing gear undercarriage.

The plane showed some reinforcement with a bit of fiberglass. But, I opted to use 1/16" ply to reinforce this area further. Following that I fuel-proofed the entire inside of the fuselage, from the firewall to the back of the servo tray.



While I was installing the wing mounting bolt blind nuts, I felt the gap between the fuse sides were allowing the wing to get drawn in too much. Rather than have something crack and weaken, I put a small piece of balsa across the area for the wing to get pressed against.

Then, I assembled the wing and controls according to instructions, followed by attaching the tunnel to the wing bottom.

More updates, as I move along.
