


The 1/5 scale Pica WACO that has been in the works for over a year now made its "maiden voyage" today.

HAWK TALK

A SMALL PIECE OF OMAHAWKS HISTORY

Recently, our good friend and long time member, Doc Greenberg, submitted this to me for inclusion in the newsletter. It is a letter he wrote in 1983 describing the origin of the Omahawks. Although I was unable to use any of the pictures he sent with it, I think you will enjoy this look at the start of our club. - editor

This is a brief history of the Omahawks Club from its inception.

The first meeting of the Radio Control Club was held at the Hobby Center on 11-28-53. At this time the purpose of the meeting was to organize the Radio Control Club. Present at that time were Paul Ennis, Tom Valgora, Ken Oliver, Ken Picthall, Ray Brady, Les Tedasco, Richard Bohls, Robert Olson, Jim Alexander, Bob Johnson, Royal Katskee, Ken Nuss, Louis Oliver, L. McMillan. At this time thye elected the officers, Paul Ennis, President, Bob Olson, Vice President, Kenny Oliver, Secretary/ Treasurer. The result of this meeting were 11 paid up members. On January 29th, 1954, at the regular meeting of the Radio Control Club discussion was held and the name of Omahawks R. C. was nominated. A draft of the bylaws was prepared by Paul Ennis and Ken Oliver and presented to the members. At this time the meetings were held at the Hobby Center.

In 1955 [meetings] were held at different homes until September of 1956, at which time the meetings were moved to the Benson YMCA. At this time the club continued to function as a radio control club, flying at Benson Park. About 1959 the meeting place was moved to Commercial Savings and Loan on North 30th Street and continued there until the 70s when it wsa again moved to the General Motors Training Pool Center.

During this entire time, in going over the meeting minutes, other than the primary concern of the R/C Club activities, two things were paramount in the clubs mind. The first was to get along with the neighbors, both while at Benson Park [and] while at the flying site North of Sunset Speedway, the flying site we had following this and our present flying site.

The second thing which was paramount which appears throughout the meeting minutes was safety of both spectators and participants.

On April 8 of 1964, Omahawks Radio Control Club became a nonprofit organizationand at this time the name was changed to Omahawks R/C, Inc. This was duly incorporated in the State of Nebraska and has remained a nonprofit corporation in good standing since then. Throughout the years that I have been a member, and this has been since 1957, this Radio Control Club and Corporation has endeavored to be as unobtrusive as possible to get along with the people who live in the area and work with them if there are problems. And continuing to do so in spite of great odds.
