The DAG is back on the building board!

All right, I'm back in action at last! Earlier this year on these pages you saw the beginning of my new project, a DAG Autogyro. I bought the plans on Memorial Day from Joe Cole and started building it shortly thereafter. But circumstances and disaster conspired to force the project off the table and onto the back burner.

First I promised my wife that I would install vinyl flooring in the kitchen and laundry room before we went on vacation. That project proceeded followed by a most excellent vacation to the Black Hills in South Dakota.

But in the meantime, disaster struck! I was next to my work table when our youngest cat took a short cut across the table and knocked the fuselage off onto the floor. That wasn't the disaster. The disaster occurred when I tried to catch it before it hit the ground. My sudden grab did more damage than gravity could have ever done. Nothing too major, but it required some repair. Oh, well.

When we returned from vacation, harvest had started and prevented me from working on the DAG. But I am finally getting some time to myself, so my project is back on the table and coming along nicely.

After repairing the damage I did to the fuse, I installed the firewall and added the mountings for the mast. Once installed, the firewall needed to be sanded into shape (to match the lines of the fuse). I changed the mast mounts from the plans a little bit because I wanted them to be a little stronger. Instead of one piece of hardwood glued between the




sides of the fuse, I used 1/8 inch plywood to go under the balsa frame with 1/4 balsa above it. I then set to work on the mast.

The mast is a little tricky be-




cause there are quite a few pieces that must fit together, and then sit down onto the fuselage. Quite a bit of detail sanding went into fitting the mast assembly in place.

Once that was done, it was time to build the mast head and add the rest of the pieces to the assembly.
