WHAT FREQUENCY CONFLICT?

If you fly on 72 MHz, or even 27 MHz, there can be a conflict in frequency usage. However, with the development and growing use of 2.4 GHz technology, those flying with Spektrum, Airtronics, FASST 2.4 GHz radio systems, there is no frequency conflict. So, in light of this improved technology, your Omahawks Board has passed a rule change for Hawk Field. The City of Omaha, Hawk Field field rule #3 has been updated as follows:

3. When a transmitter is in use, a Hawk Field field permit or valid AMA membership card must be on the appropriate frequency flag. All transmitters, except those operating at 2.4 GHz, must be impounded when not in use.

So, remember, everyone needs to display their field permit, or AMA card, when operating a transmitter at Hawk Field. And. always check to be sure no one is currently flying on the same 72 MHz frequency, as you, before turning on your transmitter. Otherwise, your 72 MHz transmitter must be in the impound, and your permit is not occupying a frequency flag, allowing someone else to use that frequency.

Please, be vigilant and courteous when operating on 72 MHz, and 27 MHz, so everyone can have an enjoyable flying experience.

All you have to do is email Bob Wheeler at the email listed on the Club web site. Bob will keep remarks confidential if you like.


