## **March 2011 Meeting Notes:**



#### **Old Business:**

<u>Reminder</u>: Memberships are delinquent after March 31, 2011. There is no penalty for being delinquent.

<u>Second Field</u>: There was much discussion regarding acquisition of a second field. The current status has not changed.

<u>Mead Field Staff</u>: There was discussion about doing something nice for the staff that supports our use of the Mead Field. A plan was decided to provide sandwiches or cookies for the office staff in the near future

<u>Club Charter</u>: **Rick Johnson** (Secretary) filed the Club Charter and fees with the AMA for 2011. Fees = \$90

Non-Profit Registration: Rick Johnson (Secretary) contacted attorney Deborah Cunningham about representing the Western Flyers and filing the Non-Profit Registration with the State of Nebraska. **Ms Cunningham** offered this without a fee for herself and only required the State filing fee of \$10.

<u>Treasurer Report</u>: Club had a gain of \$214.69 for the month.

#### **New Business:**

<u>SAC Museum</u>: On the weekend of March 26 and March 27, we will have a representation of the Western Flyers at the <u>SAC Celebration of Flight Event</u>: The following items were discussed about the SAC Event:

- Planes: **Terry Lamm** is planning on bringing a 1/3 scale *Fokker DR1*. Other members are encouraged to bring planes for display and flying if desired.
- Flying: There will be flying indoors in the restoration hanger and outdoors weather permitting.
- Information Flyers: There was discussion regarding how many color flyers should be printed. Flyers for handout will be in black and white. A larger one will be printed for display near our booth. It was requested that we have a panoramic picture of the field at Mead.
- Staffing: Many attendees volunteered to staff our booth.
- Magazines: It was suggested that anyone with older AMA or other RC magazines to bring them to hand out.
- Reminder: It was requested that a reminder be sent out 4-5 days before the event as a reminder to the club members.
- Club Attire: Those members volunteering have been asked to wear their Western Flyers shirts and hats.

  Dean C. stated that he had a few hats left.

Mead Field: There was much discussion regarding field and equipment status. It was mentioned that a new battery will probably be needed for the mower. It was decided that arrangements need to be made to roll the field. It was suggested that some other members need to be trained on mowing the field. There was discussion regarding the two mowers cutting abilities.

<u>Club Attire</u>: If any Western Flyer members would like a club ball cap, **Dean Copeland** has a few left. However, if a shirt is wanted, you will need to make arrangements to order it through the club.

<u>Dean Copeland</u>: Dean will be attending the RC Top Gun event in Florida on April 27 through May 1. Dean will be flying on that Saturday and Sunday as part of the Masters class. There are 16 entries into the Masters class including Dean's Cri Cri.

#### **Show-N-Tell:**

<u>Dean Copeland</u>: Brought a scratch built dummy engine for the *Cri Cri* he is scratch building. The original Cri Cri had two engines at 15 hp each. Dean's dummy engines have 65 pieces of balsa for each.

**Bob Burt**: Brought a current project called a *Widgeon*. It is 50% complete and weight is about 20 lbs. He has added Sontronic lights as navigation lights and will be pulled with two Enya .80 4-stroke engines using 12x6 props. It has on-board glow. It will be able to fly off water and land with minor alterations. Bob is going to fiberglass all of the plane but only use epoxy on the bottom that will be exposed to water.

**Rick Johnson**: Brought a Parkzone P-51 BNF foam airplane. 39" wingspan and had not had its maiden flight yet.

**Bob Boumstein**: Brought an *Imp Tornado* Co2 engine that generates its own Co2 for \$7.50 from an estate sale. It is up for sale. He also displayed an *Ok Cub Co2* Motor and an Monogram E-Power Motor from 1975. He had one more motor to show from earlier RC electric period named an *AP35* geared motor. Bob commented that he bought 206 motors and they would have retailed at about \$26000.

<u>Nelson Carpenter</u>: Brought an *Austrian HP .21* 4-stroke motor purchased over 25 years ago. It was a very heavy motor in comparison to today's much lighter engines.

<u>Jim Welshons:</u> Brought an electric helicopter type of flying craft called a *WowWee*. It uses an IR type of transmitter and receiver. The flying unit charges off of the transmitter


You would have to get up close to the *cylinder head* to realize that it was made from 65 pieces of balsawood! **Dean Copeland** showed us one of two cylinders to be mounted on his half scale *Cri Cri*. Each cylinder weighs a mere 1.75 ounces.



It is evident that **Bob Burt** has worked hard on his built-fromplans *Widgeon* seaplane all winter. An outstanding build! His concern right now is to make sure it is waterproofed completely.



**Bob**'s *Widgeon* will have wing strobes and he feels it is about 50 percent complete.



The wings will have a total of six servos to operate the ailerons, flaps, and throttles of each engine.



A paint scheme has not yet been determined for the *Widgeon*. Either military or civilian says **Bob**.

### March Show N' Tell Cont....



**Bob Boumstein** brought some collectables he picked up from an estate. The "Imp" Tornado motor purportedly ran on self generated Co2 and sold for \$7.50 in the V-4 version. Bob says it is a 1936 model. The others were a Monogram Electric Power Module & an AP-35 early geared electric module both from the 1970's.



**Rick Johnson** had a new *Parkzone P-51 Mustang* that he flew that afternoon at the soccer field there at the lake. It is a Bind N' Fly five channel with 39" wingspan and pulled by a brushless electric motor.



Jim Welshons had a very unusual radio controlled aircraft called the "WowWee." It flew on blades mounted to a center located motor that also had sensory telling it to back away from objects. Very cool.



Here is an unusual four-cycle motor that **Nelson Carpenter** displayed. It is an *Austrian HP .21* which has the smallest displacement of all four-cycle motors built. Instead of push rods to open/close valves, it has a rotary shaft on the backside that runs from the crankcase to rotary gears on the top. He bought this motor over 25 years ago. Says it sounds like a sewing machine when running.
