July Meeting News:

It was announced that our current membership stands at 65. Bob Burt requested help to clean up around our storage building at Springfield. Several members volunteered to help on Saturday, July 7th. Thanks to everyone that participated.

Dean Copeland purchased the 2 folding tables OK'd at our June meeting, and are now kept in the storage building at Mead for use at our fun-flys.

Discussions took place concerning our Bud Hall IMAA event in August. We are looking for volunteers to help work the event. Also help was requested for our pylon racing events. If you can help at any of our events it would be much appreciated. Contact Rick Miller or Nelson Carpenter for details.

Nelson will be looking into sharing our club newsletter with the AMA to help promote our club and to inform the AMA to the extent of our club's participation in the hobby. A discussion took place concerning out of state visitors flying at our sites. A motion was made to continue to allow AMA pilot visitors 2 visits free, visitors must be accompanied by a current Western R/C Flyer member. The motion also continued with, allowing out of state AMA pilot visitors to join the Western R/C Flyers for a \$5 per month fee, lasting up to 2 months. After the 2 month period, a full membership of \$35 is required by any out of state visiting AMA pilot. The purpose of this motion is to cover those AMA folks that are visiting the Omaha area for a few weeks, or months, and would like to fly at one of our sites. The motion was made, seconded, and passed.

We discussed the issue of what do we do if we run into someone at the field that we do not know or don't know if they are a member of the club or not. Be polite and ask, all of us should carry our membership cards and be prepared to show them to anyone at anytime. We simply can't know everyone in the club. If the person is not a member, offer them a membership form from the mailbox, and offer to let them fly with you, as long as they have their AMA card. A motion was made with this discussion to generate a 3x5 card for non-members to fill out. The information on this card will consist of their name, address, phone number, AMA number, etc.. If the visitor refuses to fill out the card, jot down their license number, type of vehicle, and give one of the officers a call with this info. The information cards will be available in the mailboxes at both fields. The motion was made, seconded, and passed to generate the cards. Just remember be friendly, and that we do not want anyone in major confrontations at the field. Get what information you can, and talk to an officer ASAP.

Thermals would take the plane out of sight, and so would the wind if you couldn't keep up with it. We would run after the plane, or jump on our bikes and peddle as fast as we could while trying



to keep one eye on the plane and the other on where we were going. So it is nostalgia that now has us flying some of the same old airplanes. Now that we are older and can't run or ride our bikes in pursuit, we depend on our radio control to hopefully keep the plane it sight, and land it a lot closer and without damage.


