- \$200 donation for the *Don Neill Scale* event this year at *Lincoln Skyknight's* field in Waverly.



#### MORE ON SLOPE SOARING By Loren Blinde




I really enjoyed and appreciated **Tim Peters'** article in last month's newsletter. It's great to see someone getting the bug for something different and fun like this. I've been flying slope on and off for >20 some years, and will try to add to the local body of

knowledge.

Tim described the process very well. As long as the

wind is blowing into the face of a hill, in sufficient velocity, you can stay up indefinitely until pilot error or boredom says otherwise. The top rating from the *League of Silent Flight* (*Knights of the Round Table for* 





Glider Guys), requires a slope flight of 8 hours which illustrates what is possible with planning, really good batteries and a catheter. Or abstaining from coffee that

morning :-)

Also correct is the notion that in our local area, probably the best we will do is the local dams. But don't dismiss that just because it's not Wilson Lake or Torrey Pines; it's still fun!

I will offer one tried and true tip. IF POSSIBLE, CHOOSE A SITE SO YOU FLY OVER THE WATER SIDE OF THE DAM.



Counter-intuitive as it may sound! First of all, it is likely that the air coming over the water is going to be less turbulent than air flowing over land, which means better

flying. But more importantly, think of this. What if you lose control and the wind blows the plane back over your head? You've gone from rising air to a turbulent rotor of air that will take you far downwind with no lift to keep you flying. So if you're flying on the land side, where does that leave you? Not only *SPLASH* into the water, but that same wind will blow your now floating boat clear to the other side of the lake.

If you're flying over the water though, where will that same wind take you? Dry land. If the wind drops and you have to land, simply turn back toward the dam and land on the face. Even if you experience total radio failure and go into the water, where will the wind take you? Back to the shore you're looking down at. Think about it. People far smarter than me have come to the same conclusion.

Next month, I will write something about the different kinds of slope flying; racing, scale, aerobatic, combat, warbirds, etc. There are a lot of niche hobbies within this niche hobby! In the meantime, if Tim has inspired you to build a slope plane, and you're going to fly it locally, make sure it is constructed of EPP foam or something similar. Rough landing areas and wood airplanes never seem to end well .... If you want some recommendations, let me know.

Did you know? The fastest model airplanes are not jets, they are slope gliders. The speed record is approaching 500 mph. Google "dynamic soaring" and be amazed.

#### **RC NEWS FROM LAS VEGAS**



Servos, an interesting subject. It turns out if you are using a fully electric system in your airplane or RC car/truck, a failing servo can interfere with your entire electrical system. For me, while modifying an Axial Wraith off road rock racer using state of the art *Castle Mamba Max Pro ESC* and a *Novak* sensory brushless 4.5 turn

motor; that after assembly, I had severe "cogging" of the new set-up.

I asked my associates at *Cutting Edge Hobbies* to help analyze the problem. We started with the ESC itself and found no bad connections or wire issues. We looked at the steering servo and though it operated okay, really questioned the performance. Then we replaced it with a *Solar 772* with 300oz of torque and "*wa-la*!" The cogging went away. I then asked how it could be that a servo had this effect. After all in all my years of flying a bad servo never caused me issues system wide. Nope! Electric is different I was told, the servo effects the entire system through the electronics, ESC, BEC etc. Therefore, I suggest all servos be tested prior to flying an electric aircraft. In my case this would have caused a catastrophic system failure.

At this time I am preparing to resume my model engine business. I have nearly a thousand motors for sale, and now that I live here in Vegas, I will gladly sell engines anywhere they are wanted. Here are some samples, all prices plus shipping:




The *Spacewalker* is completed, I installed the instrument panel, cockpit combing, and wind screen. The tail brace wires were added. I did not use the kit supplied parts but used instead the plated straps available from *Du Bro* and wires

from a 4-40 pull-pull kit as I liked the appearance better.

Tuesday 7/2/13 before the meeting (*but after the rain*) the plane made its maiden voyage. **Dean Copeland** handled the first flight, then walked me through the second one. The *Spacewalker* is a very nice plane to fly and the *O.S. 300 Gemini* provides plenty of power even considering that it is not broken in yet.

The plane has functional navigation lights, landing lights and tips the scale at 23.9 lbs. radio is a *Futaba 14 SG*. This concludes the build thread, I sincerely hope you have enjoyed reading about the build as much as I have enjoyed building this airplane.
