Reality is I have sold some of the finest pieces for many people, most of whom thought my 15% commission rate extremely fair. Locally I sold a four cylinder Conley Engine for Dean C. and he seemed pleased, additionally I have received many letters from satisfied purchasers. And finally if you call Tower Hobbies I am one of the few people they recommend you to contact for discontinued parts or parts motors.

I do not know what the future for model engines holds as electric has effected the hobby severely coupled with the fact the "collectors side" of the model engine hobby is off in some cases as much as 40%. For example your basic O&R 60 Special Ignition sold for \$125-\$140 in the last few years today you might get \$95-\$100. So when I do a consignment sale there is a lot of work involved in pricing correctly.

We all saw the pitiful prices at the last Auction, I bought a complete ready to fly Old Timer Quaker, Radio, Engine everything for \$85.00 a few years ago it would have been at least \$150.00. So I say it is a buyer's market, not a seller's market.



## Show N' Tell at December Meeting

Three members brought outstanding airplanes to the December meeting. They included **Fred Becker**, **Jim Drickey**, and **Neil Kilchriste** who presented their winter projects.



**Fred Becker** presented his Great Planes Electrifly Fokker D.VII which has outstanding detail. Fred believes that the model airplane was good quality for the price. "Couldn't build it better unless you wanted to invest 40-50 hours in a scratch build. Fly's well, a good design." says Fred.



Equipment on the Fokker includes:

- Xtra 2829/10 motor
- 18 Amp Castle Thunderbird speed control
- APC 10-4.7 SF prop
- Older Tanic 1500 3 cell lipo (12C rated) pulling 10 amps static WOT, but unloaded in flight appears to consume 7-8 amps with fairly aggressive flights (40% cruise/60% acrobatics).

According to Fred: "Probably good to 10-12 MPH winds, needed full back elevator for takeoff on thick, but mowed grass. Ground loops well like a WWI biplane does when landing on same grass. Would like to try a ball diamond or putting green as I think this would cure the landings and takeoffs.

Way over powered for 'scale' but not overly powered for fun and maneuvers."



Further: "Came out at 27.5 OZ (2 oz. over spec, but hell they always lie. I couldn't use one gram less or it would not balance without weight (reason for the older, slightly heavy, 1500 mah 3 cell). Had to put the battery all the way to the front. All this with the added details I put on for a more scale look."




Those added details that really gave it the "wow" factor were: Doctored up machine guns with sight rings, charging handles, addition of the 'top end' of a Mercedes 160 HP 6 cylinder engine, cockpit combing, and painted pilot, radiator, and engine compartment."



Long time scale modeler **Jim Drickey** is also a "stickler" for detail as seen with his electric powered stick n' tissue de Havilland Mosquito. When we last saw Jim's model several meetings ago, it was without the skin as seen in some of these photos. One of the most remarkable combat aircraft of World War II, the British de Havilland "Mosquito" was a fast twinengine aircraft made largely of wood, which excelled as a reconnaissance aircraft, night-fighter, and fighter-bomber.

**Neil Kilchriste's** great looking model takes quite a few of us way back in time. According to Neil: "It is built from an old mid 70's Bridi Kaos 60 kit that I had bought from Joe Halamek about 10 years ago. I worked on it off and on over the next couple of years, when finally I completed it in a few years ago in 2005. Some of its modifications include an added dorsal fin and a turtledeck. The supplied canopy was cut in half and the rear portion was turned and fitted out front giving the plane a much sleeker appearance. The wing was also modified from the original plan in that the bottom surface was joined completely flat on the building surface giving the top surface a slight amount of anhedral. The power plant is a new (old stock) HB .61 with Tuned pipe and header. The aircraft weighs about 5.8 lbs and is covered with a TopFlite Monocote finish, in gloss white, metallic copper. The black trim stripe gave it the old school sunburst top and striped bottom we used to see on the older aerobatic birds. With a little different twist on the colors."
