Wind & Rain has hampered my efforts to fly, however on Tuesday May 18th I successfully flew my \$85 auction old timer. Now this was not without issues, as always is the case in our hobby. I changed out the FP 40 that was on the Quaker

Flash for the more appropriate Magnum 52 which is a great match. It has always been my opinion that 4 cycles and old-timers are terrific for fun. So okay, when I was looking for this engine I found that this was an original Magnum from 1996 (14 years old but new in box), I heard back then you either got a good one or it would not run - period. Additionally these are ringed engines so some break-in is required. I ran one tank of fuel at home the I flew it rich, it was flawless and very quiet. Bob Burt has the same plane with an old Enya 48 four cycle. It runs great and with just the pipe no added muff is very, very quiet. Goes to show you how some things work out. Two guys go flying on the same day, never talked to each other about it but show with same planes.. got to love this hobby.

Several guys have asked me recently about Enya and Webra motors, neither one of which is now distributed in the USA. The problem is that bringing these lines back to the US will require some real money and the odds are a seller will not make very much, as electric is taking over in many ways. I do not know what the future is but I would advise those of you wanting glow, gas or 4 cycle engines to buy them this year. I see the prices going up as sales dwindle and the model choices being cut back. Prices are pretty aggressive now as we are in the transition period of electric's heyday. My guess is that at best it will become 50/50 with other forms of power.

Indoor flying continues to be fun I have got my little Blade MSR (single rotor) performing pretty well. I hope I learn more so I can try a bigger version. I have an Exceed Falcon 50 which looks to have possibilities for success. I will let you know but I intend on learning the necessary skills.


