Rumors, Gossip and other Signs of Decay



In North Las Vegas, Nevada, there is a fine public model airplane field. The field is run by Parks and Recreation (Clark County) that requires you to have an AMA permit and purchase a Rec Dept. permit for an additional \$35.00. You do not have to join one of the clubs that use the field, whose members buy permits but the club pays no

other fees that I'm aware.

The field is the *Willie McCool Model Aviation Field*. Named after a famous runner who liked airplanes. In my observation the field is well used. There could be 30 to 40 people there on any nice Saturday or Sunday. Therefore I am guessing they sell well over 200 permits a year. Approximately 2,500 feet south of the field is housing that



was built well after the field had been established. Evidently a few residents (less than four) are upset with the noise and activity, though they purchased their homes knowing the field was there.

The Clark County

Board has now ruled, based on these minor complaints, that the hours for nitro and gasoline aircraft will be

severely restricted. The exact schedule is not known by myself, but I believe less than 4 hours each date will be allocated. The electric planes have not been restricted at this point. Therefore, a "public"



flying field, however well established, faces hurdles as the neighborhood around it changes.

To my knowledge no help was given by the AMA nor was any sought. It is ironic that I have not seen a thing that the AMA was summoned due to the fact this really no one club's facility. It is further ironic that a public recreational facility, serving hundreds of people, is now restricted by a few complaining people. It is not ironic however, that loud model aircraft may be cursed and become a thing of the past.


Sig 1/3rd Scale Spacewalker By Jim Henley Part II - Fuselage





With the wings framed out and the center section glued together the fuselage is started next. The wing center section cannot be completed without the fuselage being framed up, so the wing is set aside and we start framing out the fuselage. The fuselage is actually framed up into two separate sections, then the front and

aft portions are epoxied together the light plywood parts are glued to the top of the joined fuselage. While the plans do not so indicate, most of the build threads, recommend additional bracing over the wing saddle where the fuselage joins together. Once this is completed we add the formers to the top of the nose section, then the stringers and sheeting. Then the formers and stringers are added to the aft portion of the fuselage.




