# B-26B-2MA, 41-17901 "Bucket 0' Bolts II"





Although I had high hopes of being invited to this year's annual Berkshire Hathaway meeting, once again Warren Buffet let me down. I wasn't all that disappointed as I knew that the real 'Meet-and-Greet' with the 'Not-So-Rich but Surely Infamous Mead Screwballs'

would be at the WRCF Mead flying field Saturday morning, May 6, 2017. I arrived early to beat the other paparazzi and give you the inside scoop.

And what a fabulous event it was. The weather was super; not too warm and the winds out of the East were not too strong to deter any flying. Let's see who attended the gala:

 Loren Blinde: ASW20 sailplane, Pegasus tow plane and a 'tailless' Polestar designed by Bill

Evans. Loren tells me that the *Polestar* uses a *Scorpion* motor, 4S battery and *Tru-Turn* spinner. The back plate on the spinner acts as a fan to force cooling air through the



fuselage and out the back. Not additional cutouts were needed to assist with cooling.

 Jack Berry flew a "Top Models Prelude 99" sailplane. Unfortunately the only usable photo I

took was of the canopy and motor/prop. The *Prelude* has ailerons and flaps. It looks like it flies great. Jack also flew his *Sig 4-Star* plane.



- Rene Mayo showed her 'Broomstick' electric plane, which uses the typical 'Stick' configuration. Check the photo of the decals on the wing and tail. You'll understand how the plane got its nickname.
- Tom Wild was the pilot of Loren's Pegasus tow plane. Loren said the Pegasus has a Brison 6.4 2-cylinder motor with a 26-10 prop. One of the photos shows the warning



label affixed to the Pegasus. Check it out.

 Larry Woscyna showed two planes, an old-timer along with an electric Mini-Telemaster.



**Doug Clemetson** flew his green-machine *Quaker*.



- Steve Rasmussen flew his trainer and also assisted Doug with his flights.
- WRCF Safety Officer Mike Lawver arrived fashionably late; I did not get a chance to discuss his aircraft.
- I had fun with my Horizon Hobby Whippet glider giving it about 20-30 underhand tosses into the air. As time passed I think I was getting a little better, most tosses would launch the plane up 20-30 feet with glides lasting 15-30 seconds. After watching a few of my launches, Tom suggested the aircraft should come with an age-appropriate pain reliever for the aching muscles that result from this activity.

We had a guest at the field. Michael Watson (Omaha)

was invited as a friend of Larry W. Michael has been in-and-out of the hobby over a number of years; he brought at 'Big Ugly Hell on Wheels Stick' plane and an Avistar. The Stick is a SPAD plane (I forget what SPAD means, something like



'Simple Plastic Airplane Design') powered with a Tower 40 2-stroke motor and Futaba electronics. The Avistar has an OS 40. As I recall, Tom Wild assisted Michael with flying the Avistar. Michael is looking forward to flying with our group; we hope to see him again soon.

Hope I didn't miss anyone who attended the premier morning flying event. Do know there were others who showed up after I left. Anyway, I'm thinking we had more fun than the *Berkshire* gang.

Remember, you read it here first! ☺






## Got Mud? Then Go Around

# Rebuild of a Favorite Old Airplane

These photos show the initial phases of my effort to rebuild an old favorite, a *Great Planes 1/5 scale Space Walker*. I have had this airplane since 2004 or 2005, but toward the middle of last year I managed to crash it while flying

out at *Mead Field*. My first reaction seeing the fuselage in two pieces and the wing covering shredded, was that the plane was a total loss. I checked some of the on-line sites, but could not find anyone who had one or that had parts for sale.

After letting the plane sit for several months I took the pieces and laid them out on the work bench to see what I had. Once I figured out how the airplane was constructed, I deconstructed the front of the fuselage so I could make new parts.

The first order of things was to re-attach the plywood sides where they were broken off. After getting that all re-aligned, I made new formers and plywood doublers to strengthen the fuselage sides where they were broken.

The photos show the original break points, the new parts and the re-assembly. The fuselage still needs the  $3/32^{\rm nd}$  balsa sides added to the nose and the covering needs to be removed. I will keep the same covering scheme but not the same colors. More will follow as work progresses.
