# NEWS BULLETIN: Bob Burt's Aeronca Champ Makes Maiden Flight at Mead on 19 October.

Mead – It was a near top 10 day on Monday October 19<sup>th</sup> when Bob Burt made the decision to put his 12 foot wingspan Aeronca Champ in the air for the first time. Arriving at Mead near 12 noon, Bob found himself alone as he assembled the Aeronca in the pits. Soon to arrive was Nelson Carpenter with his trusty camera, and Dean Copeland who had the honors of making the first flight. Bob's project had been ongoing for three years, and you can imagine how nervous he must have been. The Champ was fueled, and after a few short hops down the runway, it was ready to make that first flight. It went well with only a little trimming required. A total of three flights were put in, and the 35 pound Champ flew very realistic. Photos depict that day and those first flights.

In Bob's words: The Aeronca was built from RCM plans. It has a 141 inch wing span which is 1/3 scale. Covering is Sig Koverall. Paint is Nelson Paint. Radio - Futaba 2.4. Engine-Turnigy 52cc gas turning a 22x8 prop. All metal parts were made by hand. Ribs are built from 1/8x1/4 spruce, and 1/32 ply gussets. Like I stated all metal parts were hand made including the main gear which are spring loaded including the tail wheel gear. We flew it the first time with the top cowl removed to make sure the engine did not over heat. The next time I will put the cowl on and see how well it cools. →

### Field Search Report

Nothing new to report on the field search. As it has been said, finding a field with enough space to meet our needs is very difficult in a rapidly growing urban area. Your help is needed if we are to accomplish this task. If you have any leads or ideas whatsoever, please contact one of the club officers.

The last two prospects did not pan out. The Giles Road and 120<sup>th</sup> Street location fell within 3 miles of Millard Airport. There is an FAA directive that restricts flying within that periphery, although it is possible. Neal Kilchriste also had a site that he learned of through a friend. However, the location near Pacific Junction, Iowa didn't rank it very high as being a good site for Western Flyers membership.

Any decision made on a replacement flying field will be by the board of directors along with the club officers. This includes decisions with location and any financial arrangements.

Again, if we are to get serious with replacing our Springfield flying site, it will take the help of individuals within the club. Not just a committee. So put your thinking caps on, and see what you can come up with.

Side note: don't give up on your club with the loss of Springfield. We must stay united and support what we have and any future flying site. >>

Mead – It was a clear day at 11:00am on September 20, 2009 when Bud Mitchell went to Mead Field for the test flight of his Bucker Jungmeister that had been on-again – off-again under construction over many years. In attendance with Bud was Bob Zitzlsperger, Claude Weimer, Dean Copeland and his wife Joyce, Bob Burt, Tom Virgileto, and Ron Brandt. All will attest that this flight really did take place.

Weather was very good with 10 mph wind from the south. Right down the runway. Only glitch was that Bud had to rebind his 2.4 GHz radio after assembling the plane. Dean did the honors, and the flight was flawless. Note Bud's uncanny ability to put others to work assembling his airplane while he sat and BS'd on his tailgate.....







### George Doersch – P-47 Ace By Dave Kelly

**NOTE:** Dave had brought a large scale model he had built of a P-47 razorback to our October Show N' Tell. The story he had of its background was just as good and very interesting. I asked that he share this with the club in this article.

I had the rare privilege to get to know, and fly with Mr. George A. "Pop" Doersch in 1988. He wanted to get "recurrent" in a civilian aircraft at Offutt AFB where I was instructing at the time. The first time I went to endorse his log book, I could not help but notice his time in P-47's and P-51's. In a very non-boastful way, I soon learned that he was a double ace. I told him of my hobby of building model airplanes and asked him if he could give me some information on the airplanes he flew. He gave me a black and white photo of his P-51D, serial # 44-12067 "OLE' GOAT", and told me of a book by Danny Morris, entitled "ACES and WINGMEN", that would be a good reference.

Later in 2001, while on a trip to London, I saw a copy of the book and asked to see it. The second chapter of the book is dedicated to George Doersch and contains a remarkable account of him flying his P-51 into the ground at more than 400 miles per hour on a strafing mission. Heavily damaging the aircraft and flying it back to base. The book contained photos as well.

George Doersch flew at least two (2) P-47's with the 368<sup>th</sup> Fighter Squadron (later changed to the 370<sup>th</sup> FS) prior to being replaced by P-51's in May of 1944. Serial # 42-8558 was force landed by "Pop" in April 1944. Serial # 42-8552, a P-47D-5-RE, was the aircraft he scored his first victory in, and is the aircraft I chose to model. His first victory came while in a dog-fight with a German FW-190 in March 1944. "Pop" finished the war a double ace with 10.5 air victory's and 1.5 on the ground for a total of 12 victory's, the second highest of the 370<sup>th</sup> fighter squadron.

After completing the model I learned that Mr. Doersch had passed but was able to contact his family via information I had received from an 8th Air Force Association. I have shared the photos with his family and they were very grateful for my photos. We hope to meet some time and possibly use the model with a reunion of the 359<sup>th</sup> Fighter Group Association also.



My future projects include a 113" B-26, in the markings of my father's bomber squadron; he too was an ace of sort, downing six (6) German aircraft from his "tail gunner" position on one of the original B-26 crews to serve in North Africa. Top Flite kit with optional razor back kit feature. Zenoah G-62 for power; Wingspan 85"; length 75"; weight w/o radio 21.2 lbs.; flying weight 27 lbs. Build start Nov 07 – finished May 09.










