Western RC Flyers meeting minutes, October 7, 2014 7 PM. (Chalco Hills)

(7) Members present and (1) guest Called to order by WRCF President **Jim Henley** 7:15 PM.

Treasurer's report was presented by **Dean Copeland**. Dean reports that *WRCF* has (40) members. Income items included food donations from the Swap Meet and a reimbursement from *AMA* for the *District IX Fun Fly*. Expenses were identified from the *Bud Hall IMAA Large Airplane Fun Fly* and for the port-a-potty at the Mead flying site. (It was mentioned that the port-a-potty will be removed from the Mead flying site at the end of October.) Dean also provided an estimated 'balance-to-date' for the club. It was moved/seconded/approved to accept the treasurer's report.

It was moved/seconded/approved to accept the minutes from the September meeting as published in the *Tailspin* newsletter.

Old Business:

- Jim Henley and Dean Copeland discussed the status of the Don Neill Scale event and the associated trophies.
- There was discussion regarding the Chalco meeting rooms and the monthly meeting date. The November WRCF meeting will be held at the Chalco site, Wednesday November 5, 2014. (Note: this is a change from the normal Tuesday date.) Conversations centered around the purpose of WRCF meetings and what can be done to promote attendance. It was mentioned that the meetings should be a 'platform for enjoying the hobby'. Nelson Carpenter will check with the Chalco administration to see if WRCF can move the monthly meeting to another night with the intent of gaining access to a larger meeting room. It was moved/seconded/approved to change the WRCF monthly meeting date pending the outcome of Nelson's discussions with Chalco.
- For the next meeting, Jim Henley and Rick Miller volunteered to provide segments on their recent projects: Jim's Stinson and a how-to on 'rib stitching'; Rick's rebuilding of a 200cc motor.

New Business:

- Mower: Rick Miller said that he will remove the mower batteries and will maintain them during the winter season. The mower needs servicing. There was discussion around the club's routine maintenance of the mower and how it is being handled. It was moved/seconded/approved to ask club member Leroy Konecky do the mower service.
- IMAA and Hi-Flight Magazine: Jim discussed email that he received from Taylor Collins, editor of the Hi-Flight magazine. There is an attempt to restart the magazine even though IMAA (International Miniature Aircraft Association) is no longer in existence.
- The excellent quality of the newsletter was discussed. Even though IMAA targeted larger planes, it also provided a lot of building tips that apply to models of all sizes. IMAA existed to promote activity with larger aircraft; now that large planes are the 'norm', interest in the IMAA organization has waned. Jim will provide a web link to the renewed Hi-Flight newsletter activity in the next WRCF Tailspin newsletter.
- At 7:55 PM it was moved/seconded/approved to adjourn.

Show-and-Tell:

- Walk-in guest **David Miller**, from *Springfield*, discussed his previous experiences (20+ years) with R/C gliders and his desire to get back into the hobby. He has flown the *Goldberg "Gentle Lady"* as well as *Airtronics "Aquila Grande"* (110-inch wingspan) sailplanes. He asked a number of questions regarding gaining membership with *WRCF* and *AMA*. Those in attendance discussed different ways in which *WRCF* members enjoy and promote glider activity.
- Jere Ferrazzo brought the wing from his Great Planes "Slo-Poke" airplane to display. He plans to power it with a Enya-40 (nitro) motor. All said that the "Slo-Poke" looks great; we are looking forward to seeing the completed aircraft. Jere asked some questions regarding covering techniques and how to align the wing to the fuselage and tail. Jim Henley and Dean Copeland sketched drawings on the meeting room 'white board' to illustrate ways to cover fuselage and tail sections.

shipping costs.

<u>WARNING!!!!</u> EBay offers a service called Global Shipping - do not use it! Global Shipping will charge your customer an outrageous fee (\$21.00 to ship and OS .10 New In Box w/muff to Canada). Your buyer will be pissed



off, and wait...wait...most LIKELY WILL NEVER GET THE ITEM. Here is the inside story. *Global Shipping* is run by *Pitney Bowes*, who somehow seems not to forward a high percentage of packages. Since the inception of *Global Shipping* (2010) nearly 90,000 items have not been able to be

delivered. It seems they have a partner in this crime, *International Liquidatorz*.

Not only did they STEAL an engine (actually now four of them) from my buyer(s) and me. These idiots had the gall to relist the engine using my pictures and description. Yes I was paid, yes my buyer got a refund, and yes I am protected from negative feedback when this happens. But wait there is more! These idiots think we are all idiots. The "rest of the story" is that I sold it to a guy in Las Vegas, and he flew it home from Millard in 1983. He sold it eventually, and that guy wrecked it and stripped the color scheme off. The last time I heard anything about it, it had been repainted an ugly camo color, and was sitting out in the open going to pieces. Makes me sad." - Jud

Flying Up-North Country

Happy Halloween Sports Fans! Fall up here in *Minnesota* is in high gear! The trees have great color this year, and I'm working on the leaves today.


The center section of the *Bellanca* is under way. I mounted the aileron servo, wire for land gear in, and changed dihedral angle. Outer wing panels are done. Next I will marry panels to center section, then put in bell cranks and linkage for ailerons. Type of covering still undecided as side windows present problems for heat shrink type coverings. I'm giving serious consideration to heavy tissue(?)

Keeping fire lit on this build as I want to get on to something else. Even with tissue covering I think this little model will look great. It's very retro for old discontinued "Guillow's" unit. I set it up to fly electric power. So it should be a good flyer for someone one of these days.

This is the hardest build I've stepped up to lately. As of now, I have the tail wheel assembly on, ailerons and bell cranks on, outer wings married to center section. Coming to hard part which is the cover and paint. Due to side windows (clear), I will cover with heavy tissue then color with water base paint. No heat issue for windows this way. Believe it or not, heavy tissue very robust for a small unit like this and very true to period of kit issue. Tail feathers next, which is easy to do with plank balsa. Just sand and then cover.

This is the way model airplanes should be built, a box of wood and sticks! I would require all "Foam Airplane Flyers" to do this building and then fly. Just for the respect it deserves. Does this date me?????








Top Flite Stinson Reliant Part X

There has not been much accomplished on the *Stinson* during October, so I do not have any new pictures.

The *Stinson* has been covered with Solar Tex the *Faux* rib stitch has been applied to the wings and tail feathers. Pinked rib tape has been applied to all areas with rib

stitching. *Parameter* tape has been applied to leading and trailing edges of the flight surfaces, as well as the pinked tape to the fuselage stringers. All the "*metal*" parts have been primed and the rivet detail is finished.

I have purchased an engine stand which I plan on using as a platform for painting the fuselage and wings, as this will allow me to turn the part being painted as needed without worry of getting my fingers in the paint. I still hope to have the Stinson painted before the cold weather sets in.

That's all for now!
