November 2015 Meeting Notes



Western RC Flyers meeting minutes, Tuesday, November 3, 2015 7 PM. (Chalco Hills)

The meeting was called to order by WRCF President **Rick Miller**.

Treasurer **Dean Copeland** was unavailable to attend. He provided **Jim Henley** with a summary which Jim communicated to the group. The only recent club expense was for the *Porta-Potty*. Rick Miller has contacted the vendor to discontinue service and have it removed.

Old Business:

AMA District IX AVP **Ed Paasch** was in attendance. He mentioned that earlier this year he received a request for assistance in conducting a club raffle. Ed has coordinated similar fund-raising activities for other clubs and is willing to assist WRFC. His availability has been limited this year due to other commitments.

Mead Flying Field (mowing):

Jim Henley questioned whether mowing is complete for 2015. Those in attendance indicated that the field is in good shape and should not require any further attention.

New Business:

Upcoming WRCF Elections:

Rick Miller discussed vacancies for club officers. Rick is willing to continue as President. Rich Jonas is unable to continue as Vice President; **Jim Henley** will fill this position until the end of 2015. **Nelson Carpenter** has agreed to continue as editor of the *Tailspin* newsletter. **Dean Copeland** may be able to serve as Treasurer, not sure. Club members should plan to submit nominations in time for elections at the December meeting.

There was some discussion about low attendance for meetings and ways to improve. The construction project to improve Giles road has caused some challenges in accessing the Chalco meeting location. Rick mentioned that he had received suggestions that the number of meetings be reduced. He mentioned that future October meetings could possibly be held at Mead instead of Chalco.

Misc:

As mentioned, AMA District IX AVP **Ed Paasch** was in attendance. Ed discussed a variety of topics with those present. He has been contacted by the *Strategic Air and Space Museum (Ashland, NE)* about holding an *Open House and Indoor Air Show* early in 2016. The event coordinators would like to have club members attend an upcoming planning meeting. **Rick Miller** and/or **Jim Henley** plan to be present. The SAS museum is also the point-of-contact for a new AMA club for drone enthusiasts. There was discussion about the drone club and its initial kick-off meeting held in October.

Ed also discussed recent AMA activities. The advertised dues increase for 2016 is driven by increasing legal costs: mostly due to defending modeler activities in response to FAA proposals. He also talked about the recent FAA plan to require certain kinds of unmanned aircraft to be registered. AMA wants us to understand that not all models are to be regulated in this way; chances are if modelers are identifying their models with AMA numbers that will be sufficient. AMA is also participating in the panel that will develop the registration guidelines. They have already taken the lead with the 'Know before you Fly' program. Ed reminded us that AMA is the most public-facing of all the entities involved in the legislation process. Because of this, there is a potential that funds might become available for AMA to do extended advertising. Those present shared their feelings with Ed; Rick Miller requested that Ed forward the comments to AMA leaders.

Building Up-North Country

Here are some build pics - two color desert camo scheme on; of course all insignias done in tissue. I have to sharpen my skills up in that department because I had ink bleed on dark tissue. I needed more clear dope sealer on. There are a few other mistakes here and there, but all in all pretty well satisfied.

The vac plastic parts on "Guillows" stuff has to be finessed to fit plastic color to match tissue color. That is difficult. I'll add the "190" to my fleet of dust collectors in the rafters, and on to the next build. Going to do a WWI Thomas Morse Scout. It will have a 24 in. wing. It is a laser cut "Guillows" kit. Getting the "Royal Zero" .60 size build out again, and will try to finish it this winter. Rain mixed with snow as I write this, just a preview of what's to come.....

Latest pics of work done on little stick and tissue "The Tommy", and home-made cockpit parts made for Royal Zero build. Final fuse and wing sheeting going on next, will cover with flat gray mono-coat, much work to do on aluminum cowl and exhaust stacks. Have a resurgence of energy for airplane building lately. I don't know how long it will last....! But I better take advantage of it as there are many models on the shelf to go.













Dean's Turbine Jet

As of this writing I have 29 flights on the *Boomerang Sprint* practice jet, and have gained enough confidence that I think I will be comfortable in test flying the scale *Sonex* jet. This will enable me to be ready for *Top Gun* the end of April 2016. I'll continue to practice and practice with

the Boomerang Sprint (see photos) which is made in England.

The Boomerang Sprint has a "JetsMunt" turbine which is made in Spain.....18 lbs. thrust.

Some interesting specs. as compared to nitro engines (these are approx.)

- Turbine idles at 45,000 rpm.....nitro idles at 2,000 rpm
- Turbine max. at 155,000 rpm.....nitro 9,000 to 12,000 rpm
- Turbine burns 8 to 12 oz. per min.....nitro will run 15 min on 8 to 12 oz.
- Full tank of fuel adds 7 lbs. (1-gal.) to jet.....nitro again 8 to 12 oz.
- Jet top speed 160 mph.....average nitro plane 60 to 70 mph

The learning curve has been a challenge (*both with the engine and flying aspects*) and also quite rewarding when a successful flight has been completed.

First impression we all had was that this 84" wingspan airplane really looked sharp. Transparent yellow with the white and medium blue trim. It stood out on the ground and in the air. It has a Maxx electric motor for propulsion, which is equivalent to a .40 size glow.













Western RC Flyers Field Operations Charter

- Mission and Vision Statements
 To provide for the enjoyment of diverse types of RC Aircraft operations, for members and guests of the WRCF club.
 To promote and extend RC Flying and RC Modeling Hobby via comradery and activities to all.
- Field Rules
 - 1. Flyers are required to be current members of the AMA & the WRCF Club. Or escorted by a WRCF member, or a qualified guest (such as: active serving military personnel with AMA membership).
 - 2. Compliance with FAA, FCC, AMA, Federal, State, Local, Landowner, & Club codes & rules, both posted and non-posted is required.
 - 3. Flyers and all Flight activities will be conducted in a courteous, responsible and safe manner.
 - 4. Flyers WILL accommodate each others flying, so all participants may utilize the club resources. Including, but not limited to, the specific issues listed below:
 - Extended blocking or interference of conventional flight path operations, via activities dwelling on or above the runway or other conventional flight path, is prohibited.
 - Maneuvers that dwell extensively & block specific lines, areas or paths, may possibly be accommodated away from conventional routine flight pattern operations.
 Activities that excessively affect other flyers or bystanders that are not necessary or appropriate are prohibited. This applies to all areas including the pits and flight areas.
 - 5. Rotary wing operations are limited to conventional aircraft type flight patterns. i.e. No blocking of any specific flight area, accommodation for hovering / stunts may be at an unused area. Possibly off the very south end of the pits, if available.
