

Use of Frequency Board

We are seeing many club members changing over to the new spread spectrum radios which surely make it safer for all of us. With that is the question about need to use the frequency board with these radios. It is indeed important that the frequency board still be used. For that matter, we have installed card slots on the board for the spectrum radios. Why you ask? Consider this scenario:

Sam Skyhawk typically shows up at the field with an airplane flown with a Spektrum radio. Sam understands there is no need to use the board, because his radio will not interfere with other radios, nor would he be interfered with. One day he decides to fly his trusty old Rain Cloud that has a 72 MHz radio setup, and out to the field he goes. While in the pits, Sam turns on his radio. But wait! He has disregarded which radio he brought and is not in the routine of using the frequency board. Oops.... His buddy Fred Flymore's plane is heard smashing into the runway. My gosh! What happen? Well, Sam's Rain Cloud radio was on the same 72 MHz channel as Fred's.... A little late but Sam embarrassingly realizes use of the frequency board would have prevented the accident.

So for the sake of assuring good frequency control and safety, we must continue using the frequency board. Doing so also keeps check on who is current with their Western Flyers' club dues and AMA membership or not.

Cooling Your Engine

If your engine is running hotter than you would like, how can you cool it down? Most people make the mistake of thinking more is better when it comes to the air inlet at the front of the cowl. This is a common error and, while it seems logical, the reverse is actually true. To properly cool your engine, you need more outlet, not more inlet. You want at least 2:1—preferably 3:1—air out to air in ratio. Otherwise, it makes a dam and the air cannot come into the cowl because it has nowhere to go out of the cowl. If you engine is not cooling properly, try blocking off the other air inlet or opening the belly of the cowl further.

Wing/Tail Alignment

Get an old telescope antenna (the same type as found on transmitters). Use it as an adjustable-length measuring rod to compare critical measurements on airplanes during construction. This can help you compare the distance from one wingtip to the stabilizer and to make sure this distance is equal on both sides of the airplane. This ensures that the stabilize is indeed true and parallel to the airplane's wing.

Soldering Advisories

Someone suggested that the use of a soldering gun was safer than other types because it would not roll off the workbench and burn you. It should also be mentioned over and over that soldering guns have a very strong alternating current magnetic field around the tip. When brought in proximity to electric motors and servos, this magnetic field de-gausses (demagnetizes) the magnets inside the motors and servos and causes permanent damage.

I have seen several people come to the flying field with a new electric-powered airplane that does not have enough power for flight. When asked if they soldered the wires to the motor with a soldering gun, the answer is usually "yes."

Also you should never stick the tip of a soldering gun into the airplane's radio compartment while soldering pushrods and etc. as it will presently damage the motors inside the servos.

If you must use a soldering gun, you should stay well away from electric motors and servos, meaning at least 24 inches just to be safe.
