

Bifocal Shades for the Field

I have made an endorsement that I'd like to share with you all. Recently I purchased a new pair of safety sunglasses for use at the flying field. Important to me was that they met safety standards, and also offered UV protection. While searching the internet I came upon SafetyGlassesUSA.com which has a large selection meeting my need.



What I found at SafetyGlassesUSA was that they also had safety sunglasses available with <u>bifocal</u>. Nonprescription. Probably not news to some of you, but it got my attention. Too many times at the field I'm taking off my sunglasses, and slipping on my reading glasses to see what I'm doing up close.

A few weeks ago I purchased a pair of their bifocal safety sunglasses, and used them for the first time at the field. *Wow!* What a difference! With the bifocal feature on the sunglasses, there is no need to keep swapping out glasses.

I was able to assemble my *L4 Grasshopper*, and actually see what I was doing through the bifocals in the lower inside corners of the sunglasses. Not missing a beat, I flew

with these sunglasses and I'm more than satisfied. They work well driving the Outback too, as I'm able to peer down and actually read the instrument panel and GPS without squinting.

The ones I purchased (pictured) have a bifocal power of 1.5X, but are also available in 2.0X and 2.5X.

available in 2.0X and 2.5X. There are several styles available, and the price was right at \$8.85 plus \$3.95 shipping via USPS. Mine arrived in four days.

So bottom line is that I highly recommend these safety sunglasses with the bifocal feature. Again, they can be found at SafetyGlassesUSA.com.
