August 2014 Meeting Notes



Western RC Flyers meeting minutes, August 5, 2014 7 PM. (Mead Field)

(8) Members present

Called to order by WRCF President Jim Henley 7:10 PM.

It was moved/seconded/approved to accept the minutes from the July meeting as published in the *Tailspin Newsletter*.

Treasurer's report was presented by Dean Copeland. Dean reported WRCF has 39 members including (2) renewals. Reports were given about revenue & expenses from the recent Don Neill scale event held August 2/3 as well as other recent WRCF expenses. Revenue and expenses from the District IX Fun Fly was discussed; the pending. final numbers are still lt was moved/seconded/passed to approve the Treasurer's report. A request from Loess Hills R/C (Council Bluffs, IA) was discussed. Loess Hills R/C was the host site for the 2014 Don Neill event It was moved/seconded/approved to send a check for the profits from the event (approximately \$100) to express appreciation to the Loess Hills R/C Club for making their field available. There was talk about the excellent quality and condition of the Loess Hills flying site.

Old Business:

Jim Henley: Jim expressed thanks to those who helped maintain the *WRCF Mead* flying site while he was away in late July.

Upcoming Events at WRCF Mead Field:

August 16: Old Timers and Gliders.

<u>August 23</u>: Bud Hall Large Airplane event for aircraft that meet the IMAA size requirements: 80" for monoplanes, 60" span for biplanes. \$10 landing fee includes lunch.

New Business:

Rick Miller: Rick mentioned that there is some soda pop stored in the shed. It needs to be removed and used prior to the end of the flying season. It was decided that the soda will be provided to the *Bud Hall* participants and any remaining will be distributed to those present at the September meeting. (*The September meeting will be the last 2014 session at the Mead flying site; starting with October the WRCF meeting will move back to the Omaha Chalco Hills location.*) Rick also asked for clarification about food for the *Bud Hall* event. **Rick Miller** and **Jim Henley** will coordinate.

Show-and-Tell

Several members enjoyed some flying prior to the meeting. **Rick Haneline** flew his quad copter and a new *Great Plains Escapade 40* equipped with a .91 4-stroke motor. Jere Ferrazzo displayed his skills with a new *Avistar Elite* powered by OS .46. Dean Copeland demonstrated how well the mini *Aircore P-51 Mustang* flies in the 10-15 mph winds that evening. The *Aircore* module contains receiver, ESC, battery, motor, prop, and (3) servos; it can be easily removed and replaced into another *Aircore* aircraft. (*There are 8 different Aircore planes to choose from*.) Connection between the airplane pushrods and the *Aircore* module servos are made using magnets. The *Aircore* module is compatible with *Tactic Secure Link Technology* transmitters or any transmitter using the *SLT* radio adapter.

FAA grants Comment Extension at the Request of AMA

At the request of the AMA, the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) has granted a 60-day extension for the public comment period (Docket No. FAA-2014-0396) for FAA's Interpretation of the Special Rule for Model Aircraft established by Congress as part of the FAA Modernization and Reform Act of 2012. The 60-day extension establishes the new deadline for comments as **September 23, 2014**.

In the United States Department of Transportation/FAA notice due to publish in the Federal Register on July 25, 2014, the FAA noted the following:

"On July 16, 2014, the Academy of Model Aeronautics submitted a request to extend the comment period by 60 days, citing the need to "educate the aero-modeling community, clarify the issues, and respond to questions regarding the impact that the interpretive rule has on various aspects of the modeling activity." The FAA agrees that additional time for the submission of comments would be helpful, and therefore has decided to extend the comment period until September 23, 2014. The FAA expects that the additional time for comments will allow the affected community to prepare meaningful comments which will help the FAA to determine what clarifications to the interpretation may be necessary."

Your Action is needed Now!

The administrative rulemaking notice and comment process is the means by which the FAA can address these concerns and make any definitive changes to the rule. Your comments need to be detailed, meaningful, and constructive.

We are asking all of our members and everyone who has an interest in the future of model aviation to participate in this process.

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



My wife (Mary-Ellen) stitched up the door panels and the rear seat covers, I

want to replicate that scheme on the front seats when I get them ready. The seat for the pilot took some reworking so I could get him in the correct position in relation to the instrument panel.

There has not been as much progress made as I had hoped for but we had a two week break while we went to *New Mexico* and I managed to contract some type of *"crud"* that kept me down several days after we returned.





The Making of a Pietenpol

Back in 1989 plans were introduced by *RCM* (*Radio Control Modeler*) for a 1/4 scale vintage (*circa 1929*) homebuilt airplane. It was called a *Pietenpol Air Camper* after the designer and builder. It really took off as many built one then, and

as recently as these past several years.

Bob Hess (former WFer member) bought a set of the RCM plans in 1991 and started building it. Fast forward 20 years and **Dean Copeland** became the caretaker of this model that Bob had partially built. Shortly thereafter, Dean asked me if I was interested in finishing it. Next thing I knew it was in my possession. Only it sat on my shelf for another three years before I really got motivated to get this classic in the air.

Wanting to make my Piet different than other models of it, I browsed the internet looking for full-scale versions of



it. There is where I discovered a nice looking paint scheme of one in *Great Britain*. Former Brit modeler Alan James of *Reading*, built his G-BUCO twenty-two years ago and

he has been flying it ever since. That is what I modeled my Piet after with Alan's blessings as you see in the photos.

Powered by a Saito .71 four-stroke, it weighs 9 lbs 5 ozs with its 84" wingspan. Williams Brothers wheels are 5 3/4" in diameter and the pilot wears a cool-looking *Hawaiian* shirt. Antique Solartex was used for covering with Hunter Green Rustoleum "Painters Choice" in a rattle can for trim. Yes, it has proven to be fuel proof with 15% fuel.

First flight was in June and it went very well, discounting the dead stick landing at the end due to a rich running new motor that loaded up. In the air it is very docile and "putts" around realistically. I'm happy with it.
