Newsletter: Possibly have some help for Joe. We plan to provide a summary copy twice a year to City workers, Police and Fire Departments.

Editor's Note: Thanks to the volunteers for stepped up; Joe will setup a Newsletter Working Session to iron out basic roles and responsibilities!

Old Business:

Field: Have 50 lbs. of Grass seed and straw to be put down, possibly now that we have had some moisture. Cole will make the decision on when. We will need only a couple of people to help with that. (Job done on 12/20/19 by Cole, Rick S, Tom G.)

Port-A-Potty: Had a strong concerned comment about the structure's placement near the kiosk. The location was chosen to be cost effective, easy access, and accessibility for maintenance. Discussion was held and Board decided to proceed as planned because of future improvements to pavilion, not wanting it too close to the eating area, adding a cost-effective concrete slab and access for servicing. (The structure will mirror the existing kiosk metal wall and have an access door on field side, so the structure will blend in visually.)

New Business

SAC Museum indoor flying event: This will be held on January 18th from 10am to 3pm at the SAC Museum west of Omaha. Norris and Rick are handling the details and the Board Voted to allocate up to \$100 for 4 drawing to be held during the event, This is a way to get contact information and hopefully get us some new members. We will offer one free club membership as a prize.

STEM Engagement

Millard airport event: Hague is asking for our ideas on how we can make aeronautics and STEM activities an ongoing learning process for youth. (See above EAA/AMA for ideas.)

We appreciate Beny's hospitality, pop and cookies were served!








