New Member' Grant Schulte Hobbico AirVista

True, I had almost no experience with RC planes, and this half-assembled Hobbico AirVista had never moved an inch on its own power, but how hard could it be?

Lipo Battery Safety

Please check out this worthwhile video on LIPO battery safety. Damon Atwood is an experienced electric pilot with great insights!

LIPO batteries should not be feared, but should be respected and balanced charged with a quality charger. When batteries get old and puffy, they should be recycled at Best Buy, Batteries Plus or other battery outlet.

The three key points are:

- 1. Use a "smart" charger on balanced LIPO charge.
- 2. Use only healthy batteries, recycle old/tired batteries. (Measure cell resistance if in doubt.)
- 3. Be in the room (or nearby) when charging. BE SMART, CHARGE SMART!
