It also includes your Name, Email address (for contact information, if you don't have an email address your phone number will be inserted instead) and your AMA number and the expiration date for your AMA membership.

Being an AMA charter club, your Omahawks membership technically also expires when your AMA membership expires because your AMA needs to be current for insurance coverage.


Since AMA membership may not end at the end of the year, it's important that you get a new card if your AMA membership expires in the middle of the flying season.



# **Gray Ghost RC Airplane**

A few of my thought before I get started:


Glues used: Titebond II, Instant as well as Medium CA and Spray Contact adhesive

#### 01/08/21

Glued last of tail pieces together, built the Battery Box Carrier, installed the outer sleeves of the pushrods in, sheeted bottom of Fuse and wing center section both top and bottom. Installed the wing rear spar in place. Then started to rough sand the tail plane parts

#### 01/09/21

Glue on top rear Turtle Deck and rough sand to dimension Glue on Elevator and Rudder Ply reinforcements where controls attach Sand out wing cut out area and trial fit wing, trial fit hinges and tail pieces

**Pushrods Installed** 

#### 01/10/21

Sand and fit wing in wing cut out, assemble wing into cut out and measure wingtip to Elevator tips to ensure correct dimensions for proper placement.

Remove and sand control doubters to smooth fit on tail

Glue Wing in Place after again confirming that the wingtip and Elevator Tips are in proper alignment

#### 01/15/21

SAND and then SAND some more Install top Hatch retaining Magnets and then plane and sand top Hatch



Glue on top rear Turtle Deck and rough sand



Just need Ailerons

#### 0/18/21

Sand top cowl block to shape, install 1/4" triangle stock to F1 and F2 for reinforcement

Inspect fuse and do some final sanding. Almost forgot ailerons cut and sand to shape and install hinges.

One more inspection and final detail work. Like fitting the Canopy and Cowl. At this time, I have not decided on what motor I'm going to use it calls for a Park 480, also I have not decided how I'm going to cover it or for that matter what Colors I'm going to use. So, for now it's done EXCEPT for cleaning off the workbench top and sweeping up the floor.

# Tiger Moth Build

Although I've already got enough biplanes, I decided to build a ¼ scale Tiger Moth. I've always liked the looks of that aircraft, which served for many years as a trainer for the RAF. Most pilots in the Battle of Britain were trained in the Tiger Moth. The other reason I chose this particular aircraft is because the kit is rather rare and gets high marks for scale.


I was pleased with the quality of everything when I opened the kit, BUT there were no instructions (I had the plan sheets.)! After scrambling, I put some posts on RCG and RCU and someone from Canada went to the trouble of making a copy and uploading them for me. This is a great hobby in that regard with people helping each other along the way.

After getting the instructions, the first thing I noticed when getting into the kit is that most of the wood is basswood instead of balsa. This will make it stronger but heavier. Fortunately, biplanes have a lot more wing area so this shouldn't be a problem. As you can see in the pictures, most of the tail feathers' leading and trailing edges are made from laminated pieces of 1/16" basswood. This makes for a very strong structure and it wasn't that difficult (although a little messy) other than needing a lot of clamps.




Hinges are simple, strong, and unique. Three eyehooks connected with a 2-56 bolt and a small brass tube.





The fuselage is made of basswood longerons and a large ply doubler on the front half.



The center section of the top wing is actually a fuel tank on the real airplane. That structure is also where the cabane struts and tensioning wires are connected to get the upper wing properly mounted and squared up with the fuselage.



This has been an interesting and challenging build so far and I'm looking forward to keep working on it through the winter. With Covid, there isn't much else to do.
