Membership Count: 92

Old Business:

New Year's Day: Great attendance, Paul E. was the first to fly at the field in 2023. Ron P. was No. 2, but we're unsure it counts because he used one of Paul's planes. Bob W. was the first to fly a glow plane. Afterward, many went to HyVee the traditional New Year's breakfast.

Field Improvements: We're preparing for work on the split-rail fence between the parking lot and field (Joel Wallace Eagle Scout project), the old shed, pavilion, and washouts in the parking lot.

Web Camera: Dan F. is testing our new webcam before we install it at the field. It's online now, check the website (Camera 2) if you want to see a great view of Dan's driveway.

Park Improvements: No firm dates yet for Float Flies due to the draining of Standing Bear Lake. Dick B. has contacted several local governments to inquire about temporary, alternative sites. The city is clearing trees and brush near the runway's north end.

Volunteer of the Year Award 2022: Congrats to Bryan and Sharon Weeks for their many contributions last year! They do a ton behind the scenes (event food, instructing, etc.) and we appreciate all of their work.

Safety Initiatives: We're working on obtaining a new AED (defibrillator). Jim B. says we should have it by March 15 for the start of the training season. He'll give a class on how to use it at a future meeting.

New Business:

2023 Events: We have a tentative schedule on the club's Google calendar. The only thing still up in the air are the float flies, we'll need to find a temporary new spot due to

the lake draining. We'll have our next member meeting

Spektrum Workshop: Feb. 23 at Hobby Town. Learn about Spektrum transmitters/receivers.

Automatic Renewal (Kevin): An easy way to renew your membership automatically each year. Allows Kevin to process more renewals all at once. Kevin says if you've already joined this year, wait until next December to sign up for auto renewals.

AMA Approved for CBO Status: The Academy of Model Aeronautics has gotten FAA approval as a Community Based Organization (CBO), which will let them apply for FRIA status (FAA-Recognized Identification Area) on our behalf. Becoming a FRIA site is important because it will let us fly at the field without having to install Remote ID broadcasting equipment (but pilots still need active FAA registration numbers on their planes). Kevin says we've applied for FRIA status. The process could take a year.

Training Nights: Kickoff meeting to be held in March. Luke will get more generic business cards for board members/officers to help advertise. **SPRING CLEANUP DAY IS MARCH 18.** Training season begins in April.

Show and Tell

Shaun B. is going to be an RC glider pilot! He recently obtained a sharp-looking red glider from a member at the Bellevue club. The member bought a bunch of planes for their motors and didn't want the glider. The glider needs some work, but Shaun

has been researching what's needed and getting it ready for spring flying. He'll likely need advice from some of our experienced builders on a few specific steps.

Bob W. brought his Seagull Models P-47 warbird, showing the progress he has made on the kit since last year. He glassed the fuselage, used exterior house paint to color it. It was an interesting build because it wasn't on a board, there was a bar that goes through the airplane from front to rear, and you piece it together that way. Wings are the same way. Bob is using an electric motor.

Jim B. displayed a foam plane he got last year, flew, crashed a few times, and rebuilt. It's a great starter low-wing plane with retracts, and he wanted to pass it along just as it was passed to him. Everything works on it, and he decided to offer it as a raffle prize.

Fred W. informed us that he has found Superman after the Man of Steel went AWOL during a flight at the Labor Day Air Show. He installed a new receiver as a precaution. He also successfully recovered a Powerhouse Old Timer plane from a tree.

Recently, Fred went back into "teacher mode" to introduce some elementary school kids to the thrills of aviation. He helped the kids build little foam models and entertained them by flying an indoor RC plane around their classroom.

Fred also showed a balsa wing from a plane he's working to refurbish. Out at the field last year, he found an old, dirty trainer that no one seemed to want. The Monokote was dirty, taped up, and brittle, but it had an engine, receiver, servos and a good battery. Fred managed to strip all the old Monokote off the wing in about 45 minutes. Once refurbished, it should be a nice addition to our training fleet.

Ethan H. got a cool new FPV drone set (with goggles!) as a birthday present. It's pretty convenient and easy to use, and the compact carrying case makes it very portable. Ethan likes flying it around a circular area in their house. The only ones who don't like it are Mom and the cat.

Luke H. showed a big RC plane engine (a gasser) that looks like it had been at the bottom of Standing Bear Lake for 100 years. Someone found it near the lake, before it was drained. Luke is guessing we may find a few more lost items once the ice melts. He says he's pretty sure he has a jet somewhere at the bottom of the lake; **Jim B.** says he only ever crashes into trees.

Multi-Club Discount: Among the three participating clubs, 21 Omahawks members took advantage of the multi-club discount. About 11 were new members to Western Flyers, five were new members to the Lincoln Sky Knights. Western Flyers had three members who joined, and two of those three joined all three clubs. Lincoln Sky Knights gained seven members but did not have any members join other clubs. Field Improvements: We have a to-do list of projects, have applied for an AMA Field Improvement Grant to help pay for some of it. Spring Cleanup Day is MARCH 18.

STEMaha Event: Good attendance at the Feb. 18 event at Oakview Mall. Big thanks to Richard Gibson, who brought his large turbine helicopters for the display club table. They were a hit. Hague says he appreciates the club's support, there was some good traffic around the Omahawks table and lots of kids trying the simulators. Luke estimates a few hundred people attended, at least. Shaun B. filled in as a substitute teacher after the event, talked to some kids who were there. Those kids really enjoyed it. Some parents liked the career exposure some kids got.

Safety: Luke says Jim B. will have a first aid kit ready to go by March, also expected to get the AED.

Marketing ideas: Luke says we're doing a great job, we'll continue talking about what's best for our club. Training, HobbyTown, Social Media for key events, Youth Outreach (STEM/Hague), One on One, Oakview, Parks, Champions Run golf course.

New Business:

2023 Events/Priorities: Upcoming Spektrum Q&A workshop at HobbyTown on Thursday. Luke and John Peterson will help answer questions, John will show folks how to reprogram. We're also planning two events this year at Champions Golf Club, last year's gathering was a big hit. One will likely be in late April. Western Flyers is going to have a fun fly that morning, Luke will schedule it so they don't conflict and members can attend both.



It took some searching through the newsletters but I finally found (in the June 2006 newsletter) a record of the vote to become and AMA charter club.

Omahawks to Become AMA Charter Club

Vote is overwhelming in support of charter proposal



Last month Omahawks members were asked to vote on whether our club should purchase a general liability insurance policy locally' or become an AMA Chartered R/C Club and utilize the AMA insurance policy. The primary reason this issue was initiated was due to the changing insurance industry and the need for our club to have better liability coverage.

After the Omahawks Board reviewed all the information and the input from club members, the Board recommended to Omahawks members to become an AMA Chartered club. A ballot committee was formed to organize the information to be sent to all members. Thanks goes out to Kevin Hyde, Mike Lollis, Chuck Poore, and Ed Paasch for all their assistance on this committee.

On June 23, Mike Berger, Ralph Brown, Kevin Hyde, Mike Lollis, and I met to count the ballots and record the results. Option #2, to become an AMA Chartered club, carried as the majority decision of the Omahawks membership.

The Board is now reviewing our club rules and by-laws to reflect becoming an AMA Chartered R/C club effective January 1, 2007. At the last Board meeting, on July 5, it was decided to create a committee to review the current Omahawks by-laws. They will then make their recommendations for updates

to the Board for approval. Once the Board approves of these updates they will be submitted to the general membership for approval.

I would like to thank all the Omahawks membership for taking time to review the insurance information, make an educated decision, and for casting your valued vote.

Little did I know what satisfaction I would derive from the experience. I've seen boards led by Roger Brodd, Skip Brown, Larry Brown, Steve Culver, Rusty Dose, Tom Egbert, John Feneck, Mike Kempf, Ward Neesen, Steve Peck, Brad Shaink, Dan Walz, Claude Weimer, and Ron Williams (Can you put them in order by year, or name their vice presidents?)

I've been through the endless discussions over the yellow post in the taxiway, the replacement of the radio impound, addition of the wind sock (who was the first to hit it?) brush removal and countless field clean-up campaigns and who's turn is it to mow.

I've seen Make-A-Wish donations totaling over \$31,000 and auction sales of \$330,000, winterfest queens; pretty ones and, well Frederica was in a class of "her" own.
