<u>Marketing/Outreach:</u> YouTube page live! Adding more videos, new and classics. Should be ready to formally launch soon. Need members who are willing to be videoed with their aircraft!

If you've run into anyone interested in the hobby, please remind them about upcoming Training Nights starting in May (soft launch in April, but we generally don't advertise because weather tends to be spotty). Will start ramping up Facebook soon and plan to launch Instagram page. Trainer plane will go to promising student pilot this spring.

<u>Ambassador Program:</u> A place where new club members can get advice, tap experience of longtime members to maximize benefit/satisfaction of their relationship. Also encourage new members to engage, volunteer and become longtime flyers. Rick is the leader and has several great suggestions.

2025 Events/Priorities: Aviation STEM Day now rescheduled for Saturday, March 29. We'll have tables from upstairs, simulator, posters and a few display aircraft. Likely need some business cards. Let Grant and Hague know if you'd like to bring something that looks cool. Space likely to be limited, but we can fit several nice ones. Hague says he could always use volunteers. One suggestion he had for the Omahawks was a signup sheet at STEM Day to promote Training Nights, maybe a special Training Night where we provide hot dogs or some other snack for kids. If you have a cool-looking plane, please consider bringing it but let Grant and Hague know.

Patrick has completed a flyer advertising the EDF Jet Jam event in June. Looks terrific! We'll publicize as event draws near. Cole noted that one of the Kansas City RC Clubs hold a jet jam event sometime around late June. Grant later checked that club's calendar and they haven't listed a date yet for 2025. Don't anticipate any conflicts and we're far enough away that it shouldn't be an issue, but will monitor. Drone racing, cross country, Member Fun Fly Days. Will try to post ahead of time and advertise on Facebook.

Continuing Education Segment: Jim B. this month with AED/Tourniquet. Electric to glow conversion presentation at March meeting? John P. and Cole will do an electric-to-glow conversion program at the March meeting. Also looking at Monokote covering (Ron P. has agreed to teach this at a spring meeting) and adding lights to your plane (maybe Julian?). Let Grant know if you'd like to do one. Idea is to have educational things about cool things with wide appeal. Another member suggestion is balsa build basics segment.

<u>Kiwanis of West Omaha:</u> Jim H. did a terrific presentation to the Kiwanis of West Omaha. They expressed interest in coming out to our field to watch a Training Night, maybe doing a picnic. Well, the 2025 membership year is off to a roaring start. As of the end of January the Omahawks' current membership is 116 strong. That's the most members, at the

end of January, that the club has had since I started keeping records in 1996. This surge in membership may be due to the offering of **2- and 3-year discounted memberships**.

A great idea that was first presented by *Tom Virgillito*. The discounted membership was offered from October to the end of December and afforded the members a \$10 discount per year on memberships. 20 members took advantage of the 2-year membership and 19 paid for 3 years. As a result, we have 39 members who have already signed up for 2026. If you missed it watch for your opportunity for 2026 starting in October.

We also have about 65 members from 2024 that have not yet been renewed. As the weather improves into the summer, we look forward to these members renewing and enjoying the flying season. We also have 40 members from 2023 that have not renewed for various reasons. Luke and Grant are on a mission to contact the "dropped" members in an attempt to bring them back to the club. Their goal is to raise the membership by the end of the year to 200. The last time membership was over 200 was 2002.

I also wanted to remind members that your Omahawks Field Permit is contingent on maintaining your AMA membership current and maintaining a current FAA registration. FAA registration is \$5 and is valid for 3 years. Since a lot of us registered when the requirement was implemented you may find your registration has or is about to expire. Please take a look at your registration card and verify it is current. Our website developer has added a field in your profile to record your registration expiration date and your TRUST number. Please take the time to record that information and I'll be able to remind you when you need to renew. If you are unable to access your profile (forgot your password?) you can send me a picture of your FAA card and TRUST card, and I'll add the information for you.

Speaking of pictures, our website also has a directory with pictures of members. If your profile doesn't have a picture or your picture is out of date, please edit your profile. If you're having trouble accessing your profile let me know and I'll help you out!



<u>Julian's Junior Journal – February 2025</u>

Flight Coach Technology - Pt. 1

Introduction

At the 2023 NATS, I was shown a bit of new technology for the competitive side of RC flying - A software called <u>Flight Coach</u>. (Flightcoach.org) With a small




device inside of your airplane, you can track the position of the flight, and replay every second of it. (<u>Left</u> - a photo of replaying the flight) In this article, I wanted to introduce pilots to this fun and innovative way of recording flight!

How it Works

There are several variations of the flight recording module that can be put in the plane, all found on flightcoach.org. I use the <u>Proton Systems Path Finder</u>. It includes everything needed to fly, minus a micro-SD card. The actual software, Flight Coach, can be accessed online for free! After a flight has been recorded, it can immediately

be downloaded and reviewed if you bring a laptop to the field. I love this feature, as it will allow me to improve each flight after reviewing the previous one, which is something crucial to any pilot, whether you fly pattern, or compete in something else. Because it's cold and windy as I'm writing, I haven't yet had a chance to test out the software with a real flight - although after watching videos and trying out it's automatic scoring and flight reviewing



features, I'm very excited to get the opportunity to begin using it.

Conclusion

I hope you found this new technology as interesting as I did! Next month, I'll toss in my thoughts of using Flight Coach after I test it, and maybe add a few other neat flight technologies I've seen.
