<u>Membership Count: 124 (14 junior members, 12 new members)</u> Treasurer Kevin Hyde again encouraged everyone to use the auto-feature for annual membership on the website. Look for the tab on the website and your card will be charged through Pay Pal annually.

Old Business:

Field Improvements: Vice President Grant Schulte has applied for a "Field Improvement" grant though the AMA. Stay tuned for updates. Luke has been in contact with the new City of Omaha Parks Director. A meeting is being set up to discuss the long-term plans for Hawk Field. Spring clean up day is set for Saturday, March 18 at the field. Bring the usual implements (leaf blowers, rakes, shovels, etc) as we plan to get started around 8:30-9:00 AM weather permitting.

Web Camera: Dan Fitzgerald has the second camera up and running......at his house......he has a plan to get it installed at the field. He is concerned about the heat on the south and west side of the building but thinks it will be do-able. Luke Barker has donated the weather station, Luke H. will push to have that up and running this spring as well.

Safety Initiatives: Jim Boomsma gave his safety report including an update on the new AED. Still waiting on shipping. Supply chain issues are still in play like with most purchases. He said the first aid kit, located in the new building, is up to date an ready for the upcoming season.

Tom Floyd Memorial Fund has been established. We still have several of Tom Floyd's planes for sale. They are located in the back storage room at Able Ace. For those of you who may not have been familiar with Tom, his planes and equipment are of the highest quality. New Business:

FRIA Status and AMA: A discussion was held regarding FRIA. (FAA Recognized Identification Areas). He detailed how a bad receiver lead to some servo replacements that caused the crash. Jim H. listed all of the damage to the plane including the departure of the engine. Treasurer Report: (Kevin) Review and accept financial reports

<u>Membership Count: 124</u> (14 junior members, 12 new members). Kevin says we're slightly ahead for this point in the year. Membership tends to jump when flying season begins and more people join/realize they need to renew.

Old Business:

Multi-Club Discount: Among the three participating clubs, 21 Omahawks members took advantage of the multi-club discount. About 11 were new members to Western Flyers, five were new members to the Lincoln Sky Knights. Western Flyers had three

members who joined, and two of those three joined all three clubs. Lincoln Sky Knights gained seven members but did not have any members join other clubs. Field Improvements: We have a to-do list of projects, have applied for an AMA Field Improvement Grant to help pay for some of it. Spring Cleanup Day is MARCH 18.

STEMaha Event: Good attendance at the Feb. 18 event at Oakview Mall. Big thanks to Richard Gibson, who brought his large turbine helicopters for the display club table. They were a hit. Hague says he appreciates the club's support, there was some good traffic around the Omahawks table and lots of kids trying the simulators. Luke estimates a few hundred people attended, at least. Shaun B. filled in as a substitute teacher after the event, talked to some kids who were there. Those kids really enjoyed it. Some parents liked the career exposure some kids got.

Safety: Luke says Jim B. will have a first aid kit ready to go by March, also expected to get the AED.

Marketing ideas: Luke says we're doing a great job, we'll continue talking about what's best for our club. Training, HobbyTown, Social Media for key events, Youth Outreach (STEM/Hague), One on One, Oakview, Parks, Champions Run golf course.

New Business:

2023 Events/Priorities: Upcoming Spektrum Q&A workshop at HobbyTown on Thursday. Luke and John Peterson will help answer questions, John will show folks how to reprogram. We're also planning two events this year at Champions Golf Club, last year's gathering was a big hit. One will likely be in late April. Western Flyers is going to have a fun fly that morning, Luke will schedule it so they don't conflict and members can attend both.

Also, we're going to do float flies at a lake by Bennington this year. Dick B. has been working hard to arrange a new location while Standing Bear Lake remains drained and unusable.

Luke is going to meet with city parks officials re: the use of Flanagan Lake. May also discuss other needs at Hawk Field.

FRIA Status and AMA: Paul shared a video about potential issues ahead of the new Remote ID rules in September. We have applied for FRIA status. Luke talked with an FAA official at the STEMaha event, he said he's working directly with the AMA.

Training Night: Our training night meeting is March 14. We're going to put Rick back to work leading the program. We have a few Apprentices and Avistars about ready to go, will also bring out a few simulators and the big screen for outdoor use. Instructors, get your buddy boxes ready. We want to have at least 4-5 electric foamies available for newbies, and the faster/heavier glow-powered Avistars for more advanced students. We might put SAFE receivers on the Avistars to help keep them more manageable for students. Kevin will call to restart trash/toilet service. First training night will be **APRIL 6**. We're going to have a BBQ food truck again for at least the first one.

New Field Camera: Dan has purchased one and it's ready to go. Maybe install it after the field cleanup day? Dan wants to make sure we find a spot that minimizes sun exposure/damage. We'll likely have it facing the parking lot to show how many vehicles are there. Do we want to angle it to view the gate? Dan might try to get some sample angles to consider.

Website: The club website has changed a bit, should be a little more presentable on phones. Same happened with the 100-some other clubs nationally that use the same website template.

Tom Floyd Planes for Sale: A few of Tom Floyd's high-quality planes are still available for sale, will be available to check out at the member meeting. Rick suggested we put a few out to entice members. Now might be a good time as the flying season nears and people look for new planes.

Helicopters: Richard G. wants to get more people in our club into flying helicopters. A few members tried flying some micros at Oakview and had a lot of fun. Luke will bring a few of his own to try at the member meeting. They might seem intimidating, but Richard says new technology and simulator practice has made them easier to learn.


Building a Fly Baby

It flies!

My first kit-built balsa RC plane, a **Shive Specialties Fly Baby**, survived its maiden voyage a few weeks back and landed in one piece.

The flight was a bit dicey and revealed the need for some small improvements, but overall, it was a thrilling reward for the many hours I spent building in my basement.

The biggest surprise of the project was the amount of time it took. At several points, I thought I was 80% done. In reality, I was closer to 20%. Patience and persistence ruled the day.



The Fuselage is started, is it time to fly yet?




The main wing takes form

Assembling the frame was easy enough. I used to build rubber-powered free flight planes in high school, although none of them ever really flew.



Another new skill completed

The biggest challenge was learning new skills that were required to complete this model. I had never built a dihedral wing. Or constructed a servo tray. Or installed control-surface hinges. Or used any type of heat-shrink covering.

Somehow, I figured out how to add ailerons, which was an option for the plane, even though the official build instructions never explained how to do it.




Fuselage Nearing completion!

Throughout the process, I leaned heavily on YouTube and internet forums for advice. But no one helped more than the many Omahawks members who offered friendly advice when I got stuck. Master builder **Jim Henley** was a tremendous resource throughout the build, especially when I inserted the wrong ribs into part of the wing.

Greg Ruhe provided a magazine article about my specific kit that proved extremely helpful. **Skip Brown** gave me a few pointers early in the build. Many others provided moral support.



Coming together Nicely!

The day I decided to test-fly it was windy, but the atmosphere was still the calmest and warmest it had been in months. I decided to risk it. I drove my Fly Baby to the field, installed a lipo battery, attached the wing, set it on the runway... and groundlooped the plane almost immediately! Stupid taildraggers.

After a few minutes of cautious taxiing, I tried again. The Fly Baby raced down the runway and jumped into the sky. I climbed to a safe altitude, bounced around in the breeze, and turned the nose downwind. The plane was responsive – *way* too responsive – and I realized my control surfaces had too much throw. Even tiny movements on the sticks caused sharp climbs, dives, and stomach-churning banks.

The plane felt a smidge tail heavy as well, and I decided not to push my luck. After a few jarring laps around the pattern, I cut the throttle and glided down for a landing. I aimed for the runway, but didn't compensate enough for the wind, and ended up in the grass. That was probably a good thing. The Fly Baby landed hard and nosed into the ground, damaging the tailskid in the process. But the plane stayed in one piece! I count that as a victory.

Overall, this experience with my first build has me hooked. It's a lot like writing... you build and persevere and improve in little bits here and there, consistently, for as long as it takes. Eventually, you produce something really cool. I still have a lot to learn, but this project allowed me to clear a major hurdle. The skills I've acquired will serve me well on my next project. I'm already looking forward to it!


