
Tips for Centered Landings and the Basics of New FAA Legal Updates

Introduction

Welcome to the second *Junior Journal* newsletter! In this issue, I'll be explaining tips for successful and accurate centered landings and a simple introduction to the new FAA updates.

Centered Landings: Approach

Prior to a successful landing on any aircraft, you need to be properly aligned to the runway. By this, I mean that your height and heading should be aligned with touching down on the runway. Although it varies slightly on different aircrafts, (especially jets) I find that the best place to plan to touch down is on the first 1/4-1/3 of the runway.





One of the things I find hardest is being angled perfectly parallel to the runway. A tip I have for this is to stay close the near side of the runway compared to the far side. Shown below: What approach is better? If you look closely, the

approach in figure 1 is what I see most pilots do, with a tendency to fly toward *them* instead of the *runway*. Instead, in figure 2, by flying slightly further, a much straighter approach is created. This eliminates the need to correct during the flare, and results in a better landing.


If I attempt to land any further than 1/4-1/2, I generally tend to overshoot. This varies for different pilots, so find what suits you. Any earlier, and I find that I actually will be far enough away that flaring when you touch down is hard to sense. Shown below is a landing approach set for about 1/3.



Centered Landings: Flare & Touchdown

For newer junior members, I've also included this section on how to not bounce after landing. The main technique to this is flaring. About 1-3 seconds before touching down, slightly increase throttle and nose up. This is the flare. Depending on the model, the amount that you will change the pitch (nose up or down) will vary. This is because when you flare, you are increasing the surface of area on a wing, like a large flap. Trainers will need less because they have a lower wing loading.

Shown below is are second-by-second photos of my Aeroscout landing, demonstrating the flare. (Chronological, left to right)



Under the article are useful videos for a more in-depth approach to landings.

- -Try to use rudder instead of aileron to line up with the runway, this way your wings will still be level.
- -Remember to gently increase throttle. The result of not doing this is hard landings or stalls close the the ground.
- -Some things in the video about warbird landings will not apply to trainers, such as retracts and throttle management on landings.

The Basics of FAA Legal Updates

Yay, my favorite topic! Long, 64-point font legal documents!...No? That isn't your favorite thing to do? Despite how much I *love* reading FAA documents, they are very important. Here's a simple, quick update on what's going on in the world of model aircraft law.

Remote-ID Broadcasting Modules & FRIA

- -This law is effective on September 16, 2023.
- -These modules must transmit radio signals in ALL RC airplanes. Similar to GPS, they let the FAA know where all airplanes are.
 - -FRIA stands for FAA-Recognized Identification Area(s)
 - -A FRIA is a location where Remote ID Broadcasting Modules are NOT required
- -Omahawks is applying for FRIA status, and, if/when accepted, will not need these modules.
 - -Keep in mind every other location without FRIA will need modules.

- -Currently, all aircrafts over 250 grams are required to be registered with the FAA, found under the article.
 - -Remember to keep memberships and licenses up to date.
