Omahawks Mission and Priorities-2020

Fellow Leaders:

We had an excellent meeting last night to discuss and recommend club priorities to the membership on the 27th of September! This email summarizes what we discussed and concluded:

Mission:

To become the premier Midwest R/C flying club with a growing membership, friendly environment, community outreach and high-quality facilities. We welcome all R/C flyers!

(Ed has a shorter version we can adopt over time.)

Priorities for next year are:

- 1. Training--continue to build on a successful year, formalize the training process with the yellow tracking form and tie into membership. Rick S. will continue to lead these efforts.
- 2. Facilities--huge progress this past year! Finish runway grading/seeding, add a Port-a-Potty structure south of Kiosk with cement slab and connecting side walk, cement under entry gate. Finish Kiosk signage and small warning signs on stakes East of runway and near shed. Second electrical line into pavilion. Other minor "tweaks" including Eagle scout projects: roof drainage, repair steps and rail north of bleachers and wood fence repair.
- 3. Community/social Outreach--enhanced/fixed web site, social media use and community outreach as determined by the Social Outreach Task Force. Ensure a "visitor friendly field".
- 4. Flying Events--we were pleased with the level of events this past year, which included 3 new events: Youth/STEM event, Drone Flying, and Field Re-dedication. A couple additional events this year on Saturday for about 4 hours would be a good level of events for 2020, as determined by the Events Task Force.
- 5. Airplane Repair--fixing our planes over the winter will be the focus of the "winter repair" efforts.

These are the 5 priority areas we see for next year.

The process we take to determine our final 2020 game plan is as follows:

- 1. Board and leaders discuss priorities and come to consensus. We write up a plan and distribute it to a broader group of leaders to get their feedback. (done, included in this email)
- 2. We make an initial proposal to membership on September 27, get their input/comments/suggestions/ enhancements.
- We also ask for "champions" for the key priorities from the members. (Calls to those likely champions would have been made before the October 25th member meeting.)
- 3. At October Board meeting we firm up what we heard from the members and prepare a formal "game plan" for 2020 for the members to vote on.
- 4. At October 25th member meeting, we propose the game plan to the membership for a vote. The "Champions" are confirmed and linked to a specific Board member for accountability/communication and we move forward with the plan.

I am copying an expanded group of members/leaders to get your input into this game plan. Please email me with your thoughts and I will summarize and present at the membership meeting on 9/27, at the Presbyterian Church of the Cross. Mark your calendar for the 9/27 member meeting, it will be a MUST attend!

FAA to Impose Restrictions on the Hobby

AMA needs your assistance in an urgent matter. The FAA unexpectedly informed us that, contrary to earlier commitments to AMA, the agency plans to limit all recreational model aircraft operations to 400 feet in controlled airspace and there will be no exceptions. We urge you to send a letter to your elected representatives in Congress and ask them to contact the FAA concerning this critical issue.
