December 2019 Meeting Notes



A Western R/C Flyers meeting was held Monday, December 9th at the Papio NRD offices in Chalco Hills, with 7 members in attendance. President, **Rick Miller** called the meeting to order at 7:11 pm.

Old Business:

Rick Miller asked if there were any nominees for club officer positions, and there were none. A motion to confirm the current officers for the 2020 season was presented and the motion carried.

Mike Lawver reported that the mower bearings and spindles were in good shape during a recent inspection, and that he found a good price online for replacement blades. A motion to order the new blades was presented and it carried. Mike also mentioned that he would tend to the mower battery winter upkeep.

Rick Miller will contact **Nelson Carpenter** regarding the purchase of a meat & cheese tray for the personnel working at the UNL agriculture and development center which hosts our club field.

I confirmed that the 400' limit applies to uncontrolled airspace which includes the Mead field. All agreed that our main source of concern is when aerial spraying operations are taking place in the vicinity.

Items shelved until the spring are:

- Look to add fill dirt to the ditch across the south end of the runway.
- Look into the possibility of having *Todd Valley Farms* roll the field, or sell us a used roller.
- Widen two more openings in the safety netting to accommodate larger airplanes.

- 2. Spring Fun Fly June 20th
- 3. Bud Hall Giant Scale Event August 22nd

This will show the club's appreciation for our continued use of their ground which has been on-going since the mid-80s.



Many years ago *RC Combat* was thriving in the region; both at our *Mead Field* and at the *Lincoln SkyKnights*. Some of the locals who will remember that are **Tom Wild**, **Rick Miller** and me. This was .25 glow powered combat specific as well as scale planes. Imagine the sound and fury of 10 such planes chasing each other in a single heat.

Pure adrenaline. Just bring plenty of planes.

There is a glimmer of recreating that thrill, thanks to *Flitetest (FT)* planes. I won't delve too deeply into the technology, just pick up one of those shrink wrapped kits made of brown foam board from your hobby shop or order from <u>https://www.flitetest.com</u>, grab a hot glue gun, watch a video of some young hipster building one, and go for it. After the first one, you will realize you can download free plans and build from \$1 per sheet foam board from *Dollar Tree*.

The flying is exhilarating. Younger fliers may have the depth perception and reflexes to actually aim at something, while us *"seasoned chaps"* pretty much fly in two dimensions and trust to luck for the rest.

Tom Wild, **Jack Barry** and I have been flying a bit of this. I will tell you that foamboard planes spew pieces like a stewed chicken going through a lawn mower when they hit the ground really hard. **Tim** "the Iceman" **Peters** had me so intimidated with his *Spitfire* that I did that very thing!

In the *Flitetest* lineup, the "*Bloody Baron*" is a very simple plane to build and fly. While some of the "*real*" planes like the *Spitfire* look passably scale. The recommended *FT* electric packs are well matched to the planes.

So you bring the plane, I have streamers.



FAA wants YOU to read and comment on the Remote ID Proposal 12/26/19

Get ready for the next exciting step in safe <u>drone</u> <u>integration</u>! The Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) has issued the <u>proposed rule</u> for <u>remote identification of</u> <u>drones</u>.

With nearly 1.5 million drones and 155,000 remote pilots registered with the FAA, the ability to provide identification and location is essential to keeping drones safely separated from other aircraft operating in our airspace.

We encourage drone enthusiasts, and anyone interested in aviation safety, to read our <u>Notice of</u> <u>Proposed Rulemaking</u> now in the *Federal Register*. In the next few days, a 60-day comment period will open to receive your feedback which can help us develop a final rule that enhances safety and security in our nation's skies.

"Drones are the fastest growing segment of transportation in our nation and it is vitally important that they are safely integrated into the national airspace," said U.S. Transportation Secretary Elaine L. Chao.

"As a pilot, my eye is always on safety first," said FAA Administrator Steve Dickson. "Safety is a joint responsibility between government, pilots, the drone community, the general public and many others who make our nation so creative and innovative."

Equipping drones with remote identification technologies would build on previous steps taken by the FAA and the UAS industry to safely integrate operations, including the <u>small UAS rule</u>, which covers drones weighing less than 55 pounds other than model aircraft, and the <u>Low</u> <u>Altitude Authorization and Notification Capability</u> (<u>LAANC</u>), which automates the application and approval process for drone operators to obtain airspace authorizations.

These efforts are the foundation for more complex operations, such as beyond visual line of sight at low altitudes, as we move toward a traffic management ecosystem for drone flights separate from, but complementary to, our air traffic management system.

The proposed Remote I.D. rule would apply to all drones that are <u>required to register with the FAA</u> (recreational drones weighing under 0.55 pounds are not required to register), as well as to people who operate foreign civil drone in the United States.

Pearl Harbor Day Anniversary

On December 7th, the day of the sneak attack on *Pearl Harbor*, a tradition is upheld. One started by **Larry Inness** with other club members **Ron Pacana** and **Bernie Baker** participating. Where's my X-Acto Knife


It's January so let's review my 'How did Tim do with the resolutions he set for 2019'

<u>Resolution #1</u>: Continue to reduce the R/C aircraft inventory. Crashed 1 (*Twin-boom foamy Skyhunter*), but can't count that as an inventory reduction as the damage wasn't all that bad and

has been repaired. On the other hand, picked up (3) aircraft: Big Sagitta sailplane, UMX Timber indoor/outdoor plane, and yet-to-be built Mark's Models Windward sailplane kit. Resurrected and re-fit (2) of Dad's planes from my shed. So much for Goal #1. 😳

<u>Resolution #2</u>: Keep *Tailspin* articles shorter. Got a lot to talk about this month, so this goal is probably shot as well.

Back in November I attempted autonomous flight at *Mead* using the 2-meter *Skyhunter*, which uses a *Pixhawk* autopilot. Some issue with the electronics caused it to lose control and crashed in the tall weeds east of the runway. I was ready to give up on the whole autonomous flight thing. The damage looked worse than it really was and I was able to



display.

repair it. A few weeks back I had talked with **Paul Edmunds** about his similar project; he is using a *Matek* stabilizer flight board. *Matek* is a new (*to me*) product; I thought they were limited to quadcopters, but they have several products that are targeted to fixed-wing aircraft.

He had a '*Matek 411 Wing*' that I helped assemble. I liked a lot of its features so bought one (\$40) for myself. Had to wait (6) weeks for shipment, but now I have completed the assembly and installed it in the now-repaired *Skyhunter*. This board has a number of features I like:

1. The connectors for attaching external devices (gps, camera, and receiver) are standard servostyle pins which are sturdy and make reliable connections.

2. The board has its own filtered

power supply and video on-screen



3. The software is the free 'INAV' product and loads into the board via a vertically-mounted mini USB connector. This is nice as often there isn't a lot of room for attaching a USB cable to a side-mounted USB once the board is installed in an aircraft.

The *Matek* board has a number of flight modes including waypoint missions (autonomous flight) and '*Return to* Home'.

On Christmas Day we went out to the field for another test of the Skyhunter. This one turned out good ('good' means 'no crash') along a limited test of the autopilot. Still needs some minor tuning. So as not to bore you with the details (see New Years' resolution #2), if anyone has questions about this, feel free to email at: tpetersrc@gmail.com.

Also, if you're interested, I posted a video of my *Skyhunter* plane using the *Matek F-411 Wing* flight controller. There are some minor issues you may notice. The compass setting is all messed up and the home setting is wrong. Things to fix... as always! One of the clips within this *YouTube* video was recorded in January 2015. So you will see farm equipment sitting alongside our runway when the last *ARDC* auction was held.


Spent some time modifying the 15' wingspan Sagitta sailplane. The latest motor (Turnigy Aerodrive SK3 5055



outrunner, motor #3 so far) has yet to be fully tested. I moved the motor to the inside of the fuselage, along with an 80 amp ESC and 6s 4000 mAh lipo. The good news is that the outrunner case does not rub against the inside of the fuselage.

Completing the setup is a 14" folding prop and spinner. I

am still leery of handlaunching this 9-pound glider. WRCF member Jud Bock is letting me 'borrow' (good luck getting it back, Jud!) the trolley he has used for some of his models. I will make some adjustments



to fit the glider to the trolley and try it out soon.

More stuff to talk about next month, unless the FAA (*Feds Against Airplanes*) read my harsh criticism from last month's *WRCF Tailspin* and hauls me off. Looking at the latest *Model Aviation* magazine, I see that more regs are in the works.....stay tuned to see if I can put my personal spin on those....




As hobbyists we fix our stuff. If you are like me, it is often "fly em and fix em". A constant in my endeavors. But as you can see, fix can be used as a noun.

"How did I get in such a fix"

I've been fighting a kidney disease all year, and had just come off of three months chemo drugs, steroids and-anti biotics before heading to *Andersonville*, *Georgia*. Just the day prior to leaving for *Andersonville*, in the late eve, I felt an occasional shortness of breath and mild edema in face, hands, and legs. Likewise during the event, those same symptoms would occasionally arise, and edema getting worse. I was a little worried when short of breath, but wrote it off as side effects of all the drugs.

I expressed my concerns to **Renae** and we agreed once I got home we would go to ER and have things checked out. She didn't want me to drive but I insisted......



On day three they decided to put me under, get a closer look at the heart to check for clots, then use shock paddles to restore the rhythm. They had not shocked prior because they did not want to cause a clot to leave the heart chambers if there was one or more present. I had never had issues in years past. My my my, life after 60 can change in a heartbeat!

One item the docs ordered was a sleep study. I have completed that and am waiting to hear what was learned. Now, add to everything else going on in my life, SHINGLES!! Four days after the shot to protect me from shingles I get them. Good grief. Just my luck. My doc says it's a very low number of people that have an outbreak afterward. I'm the first patient he has ever had to get them after the vaccine. Now some more horse pills has been added to my pill box, but they seem to be working.

As I write this, it's Thanksgiving Day. To say the least, I'm thankful for family and friends and to all those in the medical field that's helping me through this. I'll add to this article soon, as I get to see the cardiologist next week. Hopefully he will release me to return to my daily exercise. You know, walking out to shop and spending hours standing there and occasionally going way over to the other side of the work bench. I have a feeling my routine will need to change up a bit. Lol. More later!

Well, not the news I wished for. Sleep study shows very little apnea. But says I "wake often and don't sleep well." I told them that going in. No news there. Lol. Cardiologists diagnosed "Acute Congestive Heart Failure". I'll be busy with "stuff" next month or so. Definitely won't make much progress on B-26. My my my. How did I get in such a fix?

(At press time.....)

I have now completed two sleep studies. And.... I'm now using a *PAP* machine. I sleep better and longer. But still can nap most anytime of the day. Quality of rest has improved, and that's a plus for sure. That's the easy part. Just last week had the TEE and Cardio Version again. I'm not sure if the a-fib has returned or not. I've never been able to feel the difference. Next week I see a specialist in long term management for my situation. I think most of the visit will be regarding electrophysiology options. So......
