As seen in the picture, the canopy was shattered with some broken parts inside the cockpit. **Don Pieken** came up with the idea of a "bug strike" or "bird

strike" (although I think I would have seen a bird and/or feathers). I didn't nose the plane over on landing, so we couldn't come up with any other explanation.





<u>D7</u> <u>Update</u>. The repairs to the *Fokker D7* are completed. I used *Koverall* and the original *Behr* latex paint samples to finish it. New golden stag graphics have also been added from **Callie**. Now I'm just waiting for some decent weather to re-maiden the airplane. Happy flying.

Flyin' in the Ozarks

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Summer has arrived. Last year at this time I was so busy organizing and unpacking, tearing down and rebuilding a deck, building a shop, and repainting our house I had little time for my RC Toys. What a difference a year makes. I

mentioned to a friend yesterday, that the air has a unique aroma today. She said "Welcome to the Ozarks". That scent is a blend of the lake, the foliage and humidity. She said you can definitely smell summertime here, and I must agree.

This past month has brought a lot of fantastic days to fly. Even though the rains were plenty, a very mild pleasant day would show every three or four days. The LORCS just had their annual fun fly with ALL PROCEEDS donated to the *American Cancer Society*. There were 39 pilots registered. Sunny skies, mild temps, and little wind made for a fantastic turnout. Open flying all day, great food, prizes and an auction. Initial report I have heard is just over \$5,000 was raised for a great cause. As you pull into the entrance of our field a sign says we fly to have fun. That they do - that they do. Team leaders are Dave and Frank. Dave can fly anything with a wing and Frank can tear up anything with a wing. Kind of a salt and pepper team, but all is well.

Progress continues on my B-26. Most all the mechanics of each nacelle is complete. Gear, gear doors, accessories trays, firewall and engines (70cc EME Twins). Soon I will be able to modify the wing jig to hold wing right side up. Finish inner and outer flap sections, wiring, outer attachment points to join outer panels, and sheeting. Still a long way to go. But as summer hits, it's fun to stay inside the AC and work on the other side of this hobby, building. Soon I'll need to use the full length of my work surface for the 12' wing. No matter how big you build it, you can always need bigger.

Today is to be a mild day, it's 73 as I write to you now, and topping off at 89. Sunny and light winds...... Sounds like a great day to fly. But our plan is to ride *Harley*'s and listen to college baseball. It's our anniversary (45 yrs) and it should be another pleasant day in the Ozark's indeed.



















Meister Scale ME 109

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The hot and windy weather made it easy for me to start a building project during the summer. I usually save building for the winter months because I'm likely to have repairs on "mishaps" at the flying field during the summer.

Having built several kits, I had never built one from *Meister Scale* kits. I found a *ME 109* on *RC Groups*. The kit was incomplete so some of the formers and ribs had to be built. The plans are vague and sometimes inaccurate. The instructions are on sheets of paper stapled in the corner. I love a challenge and this one is a good one.

The wingspan is 84" and recommended engine size is 2.0-3.2. I decided on a *DLE 55* with a *Bennett* muffler. The engine has two degrees down and right offset. Sanding sealer is applied to all the sheeting. *Koverall* material is then applied with sticks-it and two coats of Poly acrylic with micro-balloons fill the weave nicely. I manufactured my own retracts in an effort to minimize potential problems. I decided to build the canopy since I wanted more scale like framing. The plans did not show any details on wing tips so I used my own design.

The aluminum spinner is 6 1/4 inches in diameter and was uncut. A German pilot and scale instrument panel add the finishing touches.

I'm pleased with the final results and you will see the paint scheme at the field Saturday.
